BACKGROUND

At the April 16, 2012 Library Board of Trustees meeting, library staff was directed to obtain estimated costs for the possible projects below to be discussed at a work session. Based on informal and preliminary information received from vendors, the costs for each project are reflected below:

- Meeting room improvement -- \$200,000
- Pollster -- \$19,000
- Library strategists -- \$25,000
- Carpet replacement -- \$100,000
- Café -- \$200,000
- Solar panels a 300kwatt solar system cost about \$1.58 million to build, however with a Capital Lease Purchase this is a self-funded project. There is no initial cost and no installation cost, if after analyzing electricity use for the building they determine that installing a solar system will provide savings. At that time, the system would be leased and the savings of the electrical bill would pay for the lease within 15yrs. After the 15yrs the savings would come directly to us, as owners of the solar system. We would be responsible for maintenance of solar system which is determined by the number of kilowatts it produces for the building. A system that produces 600kwatts would need about a \$11,000 maintenance fee a year.
- Staff lounge improvement -- \$11,000
- Electronic marquee -- \$25,000
- Shelves for the young adult collection -- \$100,000
- Library renovation -- \$2.5M
- PLFF bookstore expansion/improvement -- \$400,000+
- Armed chairs for the public area -- \$25,000
- Reupholster furniture in the public area -- \$13,000
- Background music throughout the library -- \$2,000
