- \mathbf{m} Provides qualified staff to assist the public with the use of the collection and the information contained therein.
- Provides and operates a library facility, that is free of physical barriers, to house the collection and services, to provide reading and study space for users, and to provide space for Library and community programs.
- Collects, preserves and maintains a collection of published and unpublished material about the City of Placentia and contiguous communities, about current and prior residents of Placentia, and published materials by authors who reside or have resided in Placentia.

The Board may take any action which it deems to be appropriate on the Agenda and is not limited in any way by the notice of the recommended action.

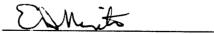

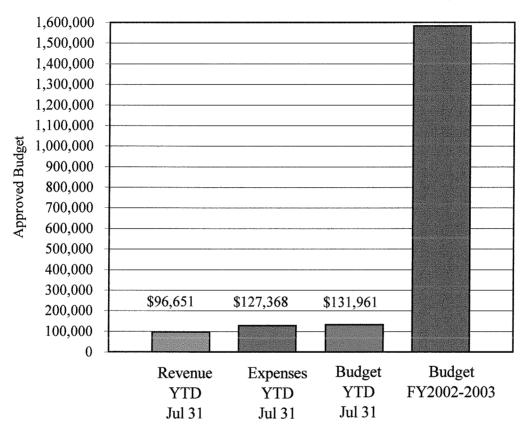

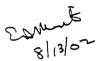

STATE BUDGET UPDATE

With two weeks remaining before the scheduled August 31 Final Recess, the Assembly did nothing public this week relative to the state budget impasse. The Davis Administration continues to remind the Assembly that each day the budget is not passed costs the state \$5 million. Total to date is \$80 million. Additionally, some 35,000 college-bound students will not receive their Cal Grants until the budget is adopted.

What did occur in the Assembly this week was the continuation of an escalating war of words between Assembly Democrats and Assembly Republicans. Assembly Speaker Wesson held a press conference with representatives from the health community to decry the Republicans | lack of support for the Speaker's proposal to raise the tax on a pack of cigarettes to \$3.14 in exchange for taking the Vehicle License Fee (VLF) increase off-the-table. "This is the only tax that will save lives and allow the state to continue to fund education and other vital health and welfare programs," stated Speaker Wesson.

Assembly Republican Leader Dave Cox responded with: "The Democrats just don't get it. The state's budget problems were caused by over-spending and our caucus is united in our opposition to the cigarette tax or any other tax on Californians that the Democrats propose. We remain willing to meet and discuss what we believe are the spending cuts that are necessary to adopt a responsible spending plan."

While legislative employees, state vendors and the legislators themselves are not being paid during this budget impasse, state employees received some good news this week when the State Supreme Court agree to hear the case brought by the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers' Association that argues that state employees can only receive minimum wages until the budget is adopted. The high court is not expected to hear the case until sometime next year.

As reported last week, opinions have been rendered that confirms the Legislature may continue to meet pass the August 31 Final Recess without the need for a special session. Some think they will, while other are optimistic a budget compromise will be reached within the next two weeks. Stay tuned.

ASSEMBLY BILL 1948

The much-amended Assembly Bill 1948 by Assembly Member Kelly, relating to the special districts' share of LAFCO operational costs and hospital districts, was amended on August 12 and passed the Senate on consent Tuesday. The bill is back in the Assembly for concurrence in Senate amendments and will probably be taken-up next week.

The August 12 amendments clarify that no single special district shall pay more than 50% of the total special districts' share of the LAFCO operational budget and continues to allow special districts to develop alternative formulas in lieu of the statutes default formula.

CSDA has a continuing dialogue with CALAFCO relative to a number of other issues relating to this issue and may jointly sponsor legislation next year to address those issues. One such issue is the provision in current law that states: ...the independent special districts' share may be apportioned by an alternative method approved by a majority of the districts, representing a rajority of the combined populations. Issues have been raised relative to calculating the "majority of the combined populations" and CALAFCO has expressed an interest in working with CSDA to clarify that provision through legislation next year.

LOCAL UPDATE

Leave Our Community Assets Local (LOCAL) Coalition continues to schedule editorial boards and meetings with legislators to carry forth our message \square keep local revenues to pay for local services. \square It is imperative that local officials continue to advocate for a state budget that is not balanced on the backs of local government. WAR OF WORDS CONTINUES IN ASSEMBLY

For the entire month of July the Assembly took no action on the state budget. All of that changed on Monday, August 5, 2002, when the Senate returned to Sacramento after its month-long summer recess.

While the Senate's return may have had nothing to do with the Assembly's budget debates of this week, it did, nevertheless, signal the start of the final four (4) weeks of this year's session--or maybe not. There are still many in this town that believe the August 31 final recess may come and go without the Assembly adopting the 2002-03 state budget. Since the 2001-02 Regular Session does not adjourn until midnight, November 30, a budget bill may be taken up and passed any time after August 31, but no later than November 15 without the need for a special session.

On Monday, in response to the Assembly Republicans insistence on deeper cuts in the Senate-passed version of the state budget, Assembly Democrats proposed \$3.7 billion in cuts to education and numerous health and welfare programs. Yes, it was a political drill to make a point and the proposal netted not a single Republican vote.

On Tuesday, Assembly Speaker Herb Wesson offered a more dramatic proposal. Since Assembly Republicans have long stated that they will never vote for a budget that contains an increase in the "car tax" – Vehicle License Fee (VLF), Speaker Wesson announced that the Democrats were taking the VLF off-the-table and proposed an amendment to Senate Bill 1849 that replaced the VLF with a \$2.13 per pack tax on cigarettes and a few other tax increases. The amendment passed on a 50 to 23 vote after Assembly Republicans argued that they will never vote for any tax increases—PERIOD!

On Wednesday, Senate Bill 1849 was debated on the floor, with Democrats arguing that the cigarette tax increase is the only tax that will save lives and allow the state to continue funding education and other important health and welfare programs. They further accused the Republicans of protecting "Joe Camel" over the best interests of the state.

Taking their turn, Assembly Republicans argued that the state's budget problems stem from the Legislature over-spending and that they are united in their opposition to any tax increase, including the proposed cigarette tax. "It's the spending, stupid," one Assembly Republican quipped in his speech against SB 1849. Another Republican asked the Democrats: "Who and/or what will you tax when it becomes clear that his proposed budget is a fiscal train wreck waiting to happen. We're prepared to stay here until November, or longer if necessary, if that's how long it takes to convince you that we will never vote for a tax increase to balance the budget." WOW!

Ugly debate. The lines in the sand grow deeper and when it was all over, SB 1849 failed on a 50 to 20 vote with reconsideration granted.

Governor Davis, who Republicans argue is "missing in action," for not calling "Big Five" meetings to resolve the budget impasse, issued the following statement regarding the cigarette tax proposal: "When I presented my revised budget in May, I stated again my willingness to consider alternative budget plans. It is clear to me that the elimination of any vehicle license fee increase is the Republicans' highest priority. The Speaker's proposal to swap the VLF for an increase in the cigarette tax is something I can support."

In response to the Governor's press statement, one Assembly Republican stated that he was not surprised the Governor would support yet another tax increase, because the Governor, like the Legislature's Democrats, believe taxing Californians, rather that living within our fiscal means, is the answer to the budget impasse.

The Assembly Republicans also seized on a Budget Letter recently issued by Tim Gage, Director of the Department of Finance. In that letter to all state agencies, Gage painted a very bleak picture for next year's fiscal condition and warned of layoffs and deep cuts in state spending. "At least the Governor's own Department of Finance gets it," quipped on Assembly Republican.

Finally, Assembly Democrats reminded the Republicans that every day the budget is not passed is costing the state millions-\$46 million to date--because the state has been prevented from utilizing certain cost-saving measures contained in the Senate-passed version of the budget.

So, when will it end? When there are 54 votes in the Assembly, no sooner.

I. "THE DANCE IS ON, AND IT'S GONNA BE A LONG ONE!"

The Senate returned from its month-long summer recess on Monday to finish business before the scheduled adjournment date of August 31st. The Assembly also resumed committee hearings, with some members still grumbling about not having a summer recess because of the Assembly's inability to pass a state Budget. On Monday evening the Assembly Democrats put forward a budget balancing plan that dropped the vehicle license fee increase in the current version of the Budget in favor of huge spending cuts, including a \$1.5 billion cut in education funding. The idea was to force the Republicans' hand on cuts versus tax increases. The plan received no "aye" votes.

Yesterday the Assembly Democrats put forth a second plan. This time the plan substituted other tax increases, including a \$3.00 a pack cigarette tax, in lieu of the vehicle license fees, which the Republicans say they oppose. While this amendment to the Budget passed on a majority vote of 50 to 24, four more votes will still be needed to pass the Budget. Typically, during the debate, each party was blaming the other for the continuing stalemate. As Assemblymembers were leaving the chambers after the debate on the cigarette tax amendment, we heard one Democrat member say to another, "The dance is on, and it's gonna be a long one."

II. HOW LONG CAN THE STALEMATE LAST?

While budgets in recent years have <u>seldom</u> passed by the June 30th constitutional deadline, they normally have been passed by at least mid August. This year may be the exception. With Republicans wanting to embarrass the Governor in an election year, and with virtually all Democratic as well as Republican seats "safe" - due to redistricting - as members seek election in November, neither side appears willing to give in. This situation prompted the following message from Greg Schmidt, the Secretary of the Senate to all Senate Offices:

"In these perilous times, a number of people have made inquiries regarding the end of the session and what may or may not be done after the August 31 adjournment date. The following is provided for your edification.

The actual day the 2001-02 Session ends is November 30, 2002. That is the date of adjournment sine die. The August 31 date is set by Joint Rule 51 (b)(3) as the beginning of the Final Recess.

The August 31 date is set to accommodate the provisions of the Constitution which give the Governor one month to sign bills and the public 90 days to review them, for purposes of potential

referendum, prior to their January 1, 2003, effective date. All regular bills, therefore, must be passed by August 31. Urgency bills, statutes calling elections, tax levies, or 'appropriations for the usual current expenses of the state,' can be taken up and passed after the August 31 deadline because they go into effect immediately and are not subject to referendum. However, they must be sent to the Governor by November 15, providing twelve days for him to sign or veto and three days for the Legislature to consider an override.

Bottom line: a budget bill may be taken up and passed any time after August 31 but no later than November 15 without any need for a special session. Urgency bills may be taken up. Tax levies may be taken up.

And if, after all this, everyone decides that enough is enough, special elections may be called as necessary."

III. FATE OF SCA 10 IN DOUBT

SCA 10 by Senator Jackie Speier, which would allow for a 55% vote, rather than a 2/3rds vote for local library construction bonds, remains on the Senate Floor. Twenty seven votes are needed for the passage of a constitutional amendment. Until recently, Senator Ed Vincent had been on extended leave from the Senate, recovering after major heart surgery. With at least one Republican vote needed for passage, along with all 26 Democrats, Senator Speier was reluctant to take up the measure in Senator Vincent's absence. Recently, we did a vote count, and found one Democratic Senator unwilling to vote for SCA 10, and only one Republican Senator – SCA 10 coauthor, Bruce McPherson, willing to vote for it. Thus, SCA 10 remains one vote short in the Senate, and time is running out. Were it to pass the Senate, the measure would still have difficulty garnering four Republican votes in the Assembly, assuming all Democrats voted for it.

The fate of SCA 10 is not unlike Senator Jack O'Connell's SCA 12 of several years ago that would have allowed a simple majority vote for local school bonds. It was defeated in the legislature and was subsequently placed on the March ballot by the initiative process. When that measure failed, education organizations circulated another petition, which led to passage of the 55% initiative on the November ballot of that same year.

BACKGROUND:

No new information is available at this time. The Library Director will make a report at the Library Board meeting if additional information becomes available.

Neither the Orange County Board of Supervisors nor the Independent Special Districts of Orange County have recommended any specific action to local jurisdictions.

The initial impact (one-time cost) of the property tax refund for Placentia Library District in FiscalYear 2001-2002 would be \$129,228.22. For each year the refund is delayed the amount would increase by approximately \$66,000, plus interest.

The State Library is interested in the areas of your program that you find most significant. This includes both successful and unsuccessful events, methods, materials and other components.

Significant successes:

The Placentia Library Literacy Services (PLLS) had another banner year in Fiscal Year 2001-02. This was particularly true in the increased number of adult students matched with volunteer tutors. During this past Fiscal Year PLLS had an increase of more than ten percent in the number of adult students in the program as compared to Fiscal Year 2000-01. PLLS was able to recruit more tutors this Fiscal Year because of offering twenty-three tutor training workshops throughout the year. This gave volunteers more windows of opportunity to become tutors. The most significant success PLLS enjoyed during Fiscal Year 2001-02 was being awarded the English Language and Literacy Intensive (ELLI) Grant and hiring an ELLI Coordinator, Ann-Margaret Webb. By the end of her year as ELLI Coordinator, Ann-Margaret was so tremendously successful (she exceeded her goal of student enrollment by more than ten percent) that other ELLI programs have often sought her advice.

Problems, challenges, and unresolved issues:

PLLS has no problems or unresolved issues. The biggest challenge that we faced in Fiscal Year 2000-01 and still faced in Fiscal Year 2001-02 was recruiting and retaining volunteer tutors. We have an adult waiting list of more than 100 learners because we don't have volunteer tutors to match them with. In fact, before the end of this Fiscal Year, PLLS stopped registering adult students and putting them on the waiting list until the list becomes smaller. The PLLS did continue to bring adults into the FFL Program.

Anything you would like to share that other CLC programs could use:

The PLLS Families for Literacy (FFL) began to grow this past fiscal year, thanks mainly to the free staff that PLLS received from the Federal Work Study (FWS)Program. Throughout the year, PLLS had a total of sixteen FWS staff from the Western State University College of Law tutor in the Program. Many colleges and universities have the FWS Program, and we've found them to be an extremely valuable resource. PLLS highly recommends that other literacy programs research existing FWS Programs that may be availabe.

1) Describe how your FFL program uses the Parent Pre/Post Survey. Include in your description when you give the pre and post. Describe how you train staff and volunteers to use the survey.

The parent survey is used as part of the intake process and again at the end of the school year/beginning of summer. Generally, either the FFL Coordinator or a Federal work-study student does intake. A tutor administers the post survey during a regular tutoring session when staff is there and can clarify questions. The program is small enough there is not a set training procedure.

2. Describe barriers your FFL program encountered using the Parent pre/post survey.

There have been a few problems using the parent pre/post form most often during intake. Some parents will give the answer they think the interviewer wants to hear. Others (many of them ESL students) are confused when there is a relative scale involved. So, when an intake is scheduled to take place a bilingual staff member is usually present. To verify the validity of the survey results, the interviewer sometimes rephrases the question after the survey is finished.

3) Describe successes your FFL program discovered using the Parent pre/post survey.

Our Parent Survey results show, among other things, that most parents have library cards at the end of the year. That's no surprise since applying for a card is part of the intake procedure. However, the survey also shows families coming to the library more often, more time spent reading to children, and a greater awareness about where to obtain information about health issues (effects of smoking etc.).

4) What are the best messages your program used to explain your FFL program to stakeholders and the public?

The themes we emphasize in our program tend to be "success" "Fun" and "Family". Everyone would like to have their children do well in school. When parents hear "You are your child's first teacher and if you read regularly to him/her, he/she will begin school with a greater intellectual advantage" they are prepared to work hard to improve their literacy skills in order to help their children have an advantage. Since nobody really likes "work" but everyone loves "fun" we emphasize the enjoyment to be had from reading, that learning can be fun, and the activities sponsored by the library and FFL can be enjoyed by the entire family.

5) Share one positive FFL experience that represents your program's success in helping families with early literacy skills. Your

example can include a testimony, anecdote, or observation from staff, parents, children or community partners.

Young Jessica is a metaphor for the whole program. When her family first started coming to tutoring she was only interested in drawing and puzzles. She still enjoys these activities, but now the first thing she does is she selects a picture book out of the Children's Department and reads it. She may select another one, or she might want a puzzle or to color. But she now spends as much time if not more looking at books or having someone read to her. That in itself is wonderful, but I'm seeing that pattern among all the children of families who have been coming to the library over the past six months to a year.

6) Share a fun storytime theme your program used this year. Select something you would recommend to other family literacy programs. Include names of books, materials, songs, fingerplays, crafts, etc. Provide advice or tips to someone who might want to replicate your idea.

A good storytime theme I've used is Differences. First talk about Penguins (they're birds, but they can't fly!) and then read "Tacky the Penguin" by Helen Lester. Using little paper Penguin finger puppets have the group sing "Five Little Penguins Jumping on the Bed". Ask the group what it would be like if they could fly, then ask would they like to be able to fly, what would they do, then read "Abuela" by Arthur Dorros and "Angela's Wings" by Eric Jon Nones. Finish by affirming that being different isn't always a bad thing, and differences make us all very interesting.

The target population for the Placentia Library Literacy Services' ELLI Program is kindergarten through 6th grade students who attend Ruby Drive, Rio Vista and John Tynes Elementary schools and their families. In particular the ELLI Program focuses on those children who are emerging English learners or who come from homes where English is spoken as a second language or not at all. Many of these children come from low income families with low literacy rates and limited formal education. The PLLS also focuses on reaching the parents of children attending the

Placentia Child Development Center, a Head Start facility. These parents also have children attending the elementary schools in the ELLI Program, and represent an underserved population with limited English skills.

- 6. Program Overview. Give a brief overview of your ELLI program. Please include a bullet point for each of these items: recruitment techniques, specific activities, the instructional model and curriculum used, scheduling details (sites and frequency of meetings), and staff responsibilities.
 - Recruitment. Once the ELLI Coordinator met with the administration at each school and established the partnership, students were selected by the administration and teachers at each school. Principals decided which group of students needed help the most (for example 1st graders, students in kindergarten extended day programs, emerging English learners). We then either worked with the entire group, or asked teachers to select specific students within the group who were behind or having the most difficulties. The exception to this was at John Tynes Elementary, where in addition to the students identified by the principal and teachers as needing help, ELLI staff chose to also work with children whose parent were attending CBET classes, as we knew they were a group at risk for problems speaking. reading and writing in English. The ELLI staff also obtained a list from the Placentia Child Development Center (Head Start) of students from their program who were attending each school. This list was submitted to each school's administration and ELLI staff indicated this was an at risk group of students who should be included in the program if possible. Working with the Director of the Placentia Child Development Center, the PLLS recruited parents for an ESL class that was taught at the nearby Whitten Community Center. In collaboration with CBET instructors, ELLI staff met with parents and recruited them for tutoring, library events, classes and workshops.
 - Specific Activities. ELLI tutors worked in existing programs and classrooms at all three schools. Activities varied at each school, depending upon when and where we were tutoring the students. At Rio Vista, all tutoring took place in the classroom, once or twice a week. Tutors were under the direction of individual teachers in each classroom. Each tutor at Rio Vista focused on bringing up the reading level of the students and utilized classroom materials and curriculum provided by the teacher. At John Tynes, tutors also worked in the classroom every week with students and used the materials and curriculum preferred by the teachers. Tutors who helped children whose parents were attending CBET classes at John Tynes read with students, using books from the Placentia Library and the school library, and assisted each child with his or her language arts homework. At Ruby Drive, tutors worked with the teachers of a kindergarten extended day program (KED). Activities included games that focused on learning the alphabet, shapes and colors in English; art activities that also involved spelling simple words; and singing with song books. Tutors also assisted students in writing workshops, read to them and listened to the students' first attempts to read. Tutors provided homework assistance in language arts and other subjects in an after school program called Project Casa at Ruby Drive. For the children whose parents were in CBET classes at Ruby Drive, tutors were able to provide homework assistance as well as a variety of fun, literacy based activities. These activities included word games, spelling bees, journal writing, story rounds, poetry reading, making scrapbooks and photography/essay projects. A limited number of students were also signed up by their parents to receive tutoring in the library. For the adult family members of these students, the ELLI Program provided books, language tapes and other educational materials. The ELLI Coordinator hosted the parents at the Library for a special tour, and visited the classroom to sign up

- parents and children for different Library events. Adult family members of the ELLI students also signed up for one-to-one tutoring at the Library, and attended ESL classes.
- Instructional model and curriculum used. Tutors used materials students were using in class: textbooks, homework assignments and works of fiction available in each school. Tutors also used books from the Library, educational games from the PLLS and literacy based art activities developed by the ELLI Coordinator. Tutors worked one-to-one and in small groups with students. For adult students, ELLI tutors used the Challenger or Laubach series of workbooks as well as the Oxford Picture Dictionary.
- Scheduling details. Tutors met with students between once a week to four times a week, depending on the student, from the beginning of January through the beginning of June. Tutors met with students at the three elementary schools in the program and the Whitten Center. Students in the KED were rotated; 40 students participated from January through February and 40 more participated from March through the beginning of June. Student attendance fluctuated in the CBET Programs and in Project Casa. New students joined the program throughout the year, others attended Monday-Thursday and some came off and on throughout the school year.
- Staff Responsibilities. The ELLI Coordinator was responsible for all aspects of the PLLS's ELLI Program including: establishing partnerships with all of the community organizations involved in the project; meeting with the appropriate staff at each school to determine when, where and how tutors would work with the students; recruiting, assisting with training, scheduling and supervising tutors; developing and implementing activities for students; providing tutoring for a certain percentage of the students; conducting all outreach to publicize the program; and preparing all reports and correspondence related to the ELLI Program. The Literacy Coordinator/Public Services Manager was responsible for supervising the ELLI Coordinator, training tutors for the program and assisting with outreach activities. The Families for Literacy Coordinator provided 10 hours a week of tutoring at John Tynes Elementary School. There were six FWS students whose wages were paid entirely through the America Reads Program who were responsible for tutoring students. Two interns from Cal State Fullerton also tutored in the ELLI Program.
- 8. Program Goals. What goals did you set for yourself in your initial grant proposal and have you reached those goals?

The PLLS's overall goal was to increase literacy services to an underserved population in the community. Specifically, the PLLS wanted to provide tutors for 150-200 K-6th grade students at three elementary schools: Ruby Drive, Rio Vista and John Tynes. In addition to this goal the PLLS wanted to provide literacy and library services for family members of these children, and renovate its existing literacy area. All of these goals were achieved. Tutors were provided for over 200 K-6th grade students at these three schools. The parents of ELLI students were hosted at the Library, provided with books and educational materials, offered an ESL class and tutors at the Library. The literacy area was completely renovated, including the purchase of three new computers, a color printer, whiteboards and new tables and chairs, enabling the PLLS to implement the additional services offered to the ELLI families.

9. Outcomes Measures. Detail the results or outcomes that demonstrate how your ELLI program has had a positive impact on families and learning. Include results from any parent or teacher surveys, attendance and retention data, and any anecdotes that reflect increased English language literacy skills and improved self-esteem among your participants.

Since the ELLI Coordinator and ELLI tutors worked side by side with the teachers on a weekly basis in the schools, they had the opportunity to receive verbal feedback from the teachers regarding students' progress. In addition to verbal feedback, teachers were asked to fill out end of year surveys. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive. All of the teachers felt the ELLI tutors helped their students improve their ability to read, write and speak English. Specifically, teachers felt having ELLI tutors provided the extra "nudge" students needed to begin reading or become more proficient readers. Scores on spelling and grammar tests went up and reading comprehension improved. End of year testing of the KED students revealed significant improvements. Homework grades for 3rd-5th graders also improved after they began working with tutors. Teachers also felt that the ELLI tutors ability to work one to one with students benefited not only the neediest students but the entire class. Having tutors to focus on those students in need of extra help allowed teachers to work with the rest of the class. Students looked forward to the special time spent with their tutors, most of whom were college students. Many students began articulating plans for college after being mentored and encouraged by their tutors.

10. Successes. Describe those elements of your program that you feel have been most successful. What are the key factors that have contributed to their success?

Through the ELLI Program the library has been able to reach out to a previously underserved, diverse and bilingual community. The ELLI Program has established the Library's commitment to provide literacy and other library services to this community. This was accomplished through the strong partnerships formed with individual teachers at Ruby Drive; the principal of Ruby Drive; the Director of the Placentia Child Development Center, and with individual students and their families. This commitment has led to increased use of the library by this community as well as strong and enthusiastic participation in the ELLI Program. In particular, the ELLI Program's involvement in the KED program at Ruby Drive was successful. This KED Program primarily served children who were emerging English learners. Tutors were directed by the KED Program's two teachers, both of whom felt the tutors were instrumental in helping these children acquire the English skills they needed. Working with the children of CBET adult students was another strong component of the ELLI Program. These children were essentially being babysat while their parents took CBET classes until ELLI tutors started working with them. These children received homework assistance and help with reading, participated in literacy based arts and craft activities and bonded with their tutors.

11. Challenges. Describe the most difficult challenges your program has faced so far and what actions you have initiated to overcome them. Have these actions proved successful?

The biggest challenge faced was parental and family involvement in the ELLI Program. The majority of parents worked and had limited time, lacked transportation that would get them to the Library and needed childcare while they were at the Library. As often as possible, ELLI staff went offsite to accommodate the parents. Instead of having parents come to the Library to sign up for reading programs and events, the ELLI Coordinator went to the CBET classes. Materials from the PLLS Literacy Library were donated to the CBET classes so they could be used there. Parents were provided with library card applications ahead of time, and the Library opened early to accommodate

a tour and the processing of their applications. After repeated visits from the ELLI Coordinator, family members began signing up for one to one tutoring at the Library. By the end of the school year, families that had obtained library cards earlier began coming to the Library on Sundays. An ESL class was offered offsite at a community center near where many of the parents lived. Through a partnership with the Placentia Child Development Center babysitting was also provided. These steps took care of the problems of transportation and child care. Parent and family involvement in the ELLI Program continued to fluctuate due to changing work schedules and long hours at work. One additional challenge was staffing. Originally the ELLI Program was to be staffed primarily by volunteer teen tutors from the Rotary Reading Assistance Program (RRAP). However, upon meeting with each school administration it became apparent that tutors would be needed primarily during school hours, not after school. As a result of this, the ELLI Program utilized a much smaller group of Federal Work Study students in place of the high school RRAP tutors. The ELLI Coordinator also established an internship program with Cal State Fullerton, and accepted volunteers on a rotating, short term basis rather than the usual six month commitment required by the PLLS. The ELLI Coordinator also spent a considerable portion of her time working with the children as well. The combination of these efforts enabled the ELLI Coordinator to not only meet but exceed the original goal of serving between 150-200 students.

12. Changes. What changes (if any) have you made to your initial grant proposal and what necessitated those changes?

As stated before, fewer RRAP tutors were used, and there was more small group tutoring and less one-to-one tutoring due to a lack of tutors.

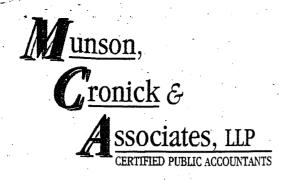

We are pleased to present our proposal to provide professional services for the Placentia Library District for the year ended June 30, 2002.

We will audit the balance sheet of Placentia Library District as of June 30, 2002, and the related statements of revenue, expenditures and changes in fund balances for the year then ended.

Our audit will be made in accordance with United States generally accepted auditing standards and will include tests of your accounting records and other procedures we consider necessary to enable us to express an unqualified opinion that your financial statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with United States generally accepted accounting principles. If our opinion is other than unqualified, we will fully discuss the reasons with you in advance.

Our procedures will include tests of documentary evidence supporting the transactions recorded in the accounts and direct confirmation of receivables and certain other assets and liabilities by correspondence with selected banks and the County of Orange. At the conclusion of our audit, we will also request certain written representations from you about the financial statements and related matters.

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements; therefore, our audits will involve judgment about the number of transactions to be examined and the areas to be tested. Also, we will plan and perform the audits to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. However, because of the concept of reasonable assurance and because we will not perform a detailed examination of all transactions, there is a risk that material errors, irregularities, or illegal acts, including fraud or defalcations, may exist and not be detected by us. We will advise you, however, of any matters of that nature that come to our attention. Our responsibility as auditors is limited to the period covered by our audits.

EGTRRA AMENDMENT TO

Placentia Library District (name of plan)

(Pursuant to IRS Notice 2001-57)

Preamble

- 1. Adoption and effective date of amendment. This amendment of the plan is adopted to reflect certain provisions of the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001 ("EGTRRA"). This amendment is intended as good faith compliance with the requirements of EGTRRA and is to be construed in accordance with EGTRRA and guidance issued thereunder. Except as otherwise provided, this amendment shall be effective as of the first day of the first plan year beginning after December 31, 2001.
- 2. Supersession of inconsistent provisions. This amendment shall supersede the provisions of the plan to the extent those provisions are inconsistent with the provisions of this amendment.
- 3. Increase in Compensation Limit. The annual compensation of each participant taken into account in determining allocations for any plan year beginning after December 31, 2001, shall not exceed \$200,000, as adjusted for cost-of-living increases in accordance with Section 401(a)(17)(B) of the Code. Annual compensation means compensation during the plan year or such other consecutive 12-month period over which compensation is otherwise determined under the plan (the determination period. The cost-of-living adjustment in effect for a calendar year applies to annual compensation for the determination period that begins with or within such calendar year.
- Modification of Top-heavy Rules
- 4.1 Effective date. This section shall apply for purposes of determining whether the plan is a top-heavy plan under Section 416(g) of the Code for plan years beginning after December 31, 2001, and whether the plan satisfies the minimum benefits requirements of Section 416(c) of the Code for such years. This Section amends the sections of the plan that include top-heavy provisions.
- 4.2 Determination of top-heavy status.
- 4.2.1 Key employee. Key employee means any employee or former employee (including any deceased employee) who at any time during the plan year that includes the determination date was an officer of the employer having annual compensation greater than \$130.000 (as adjusted under Section 416(i)(1) of the Code for plan years beginning after December 31, 2002), a 5-percent owner of the employer, or a 1-percent owner of the employer having annual compensation of more than \$150.000. For this purpose, annual compensation means compensation within the meaning of Section 415(c)(3) of the Code. The determination of who is a key employee will be made in accordance with Section 416(i)(1) of the Code and the applicable regulations and other guidance of general applicability issued thereunder.
- 4.2.2 Determination of present values and amounts. This Section 4.2.2 shall apply for purposes of determining the present values of accrued benefits and the amounts of account balances of employees as of the determination date.
- 4.2.2.1 Distributions during year ending on the determination date. The present values of accrued benefits and the amounts of account balances of an employee as of the determination date shall be increased by the distributions made with respect to the employee under the plan and any plan aggregated with the plan under Section 416(g)(2) of the Code during the 1-year period ending on the determination date. The preceding sentence shall also apply to distributions under a terminated plan which, had it not been terminated, would have been aggregated with the plan under section 416(g)(2)(A)(i) of the Code. In the case of a distribution made for a reason other than separation from service, death, or disability, this provision shall be applied by substituting 5-year period for 1-year period.

- 4.2.2.2 Employees not performing services during year ending on the determination date. The accrued benefits and accounts of any individual who has not performed services for the employer during the 1-year period ending on the determination date shall not be taken into account.
- 4.3 Minimum benefits.
- 4.3.1 Matching contributions. Employer matching contributions shall be taken into account for purposes of satisfying the minimum contribution requirements of Section 416(c)(2) of the Code and the plan. The preceding sentence shall apply with respect to matching contributions under the plan or, if the plan provides that the minimum contribution requirement shall be met in another plan, such other plan. Employer matching contributions that are used to satisfy the minimum contribution requirements shall be treated as matching contributions for purposes of the actual contribution percentage test and other requirements of Section 401(m) of the Code.
- 4.3.2 Contributions under other plans. The employer may provide, in a supplemental writing that is an adoption agreement, schedule, appendix or addendum, that the minimum benefit requirement shall be met in another plan (including another plan that consists solely of a cash or deferred arrangement which meets the requirements of Section 401(k)(12) of the Code and matching contributions with respect to which the requirements of Section 401(m)(11) of the Code are met). Said supplement will include the name of the other plan, the minimum benefit that will be provided under such other plan, and the employees who will receive the minimum benefit under such other plan.
- 4.4 Safe Harbor Plan Provisions. The top-heavy requirements of Section 416 of the Code and the plan shall not apply in any year beginning after December 31, 2001, in which the plan consists solely of a cash or deferred arrangement which meets the requirements of Section 401(k)(12) of the Code and matching contributions with respect to which the requirements of Section 401(m)(11) of the Code are met.
- 5. Limitation on Contributions.
- 5.1 Effective date. This section shall be effective for limitation years beginning after December 31, 2001, and shall supersede the comparable prior plan provisions that limit annual additions under Section 415(c).
- 5.2 Maximum Annual Addition. Except to the extent permitted under any plan provision that permits catch-up contributions and Section 414(v) of the Code, if applicable, the annual addition that may be contributed or allocated to a participant's account under the plan for any limitation year shall not exceed the lesser of:
 - (a) \$40,000. as adjusted for increases in the cost-of-living under Section 415(d) of the Code. or
 - (b) 100 percent of the participant's compensation, within the meaning of Section 415(c)(3) of the Code, for the limitation year.

The compensation limit referred to in (b) shall not apply to any contribution for medical benefits after separation from service (within the meaning of Section 401(h) or Section 419A(f)(2) of the Code) which is otherwise treated as an annual addition.
