



SUBJECT: Results of Employee Survey of Group Health Plans

#### **BACKGROUND:**

At its meeting on November 4, 1991, the Library Board requested that the staff eligible to receive Library medical benefits be surveyed to see if they are using the benefits and to measure their level of satisfaction.

Upon receipt of a sample survey from Carol Benson, Anderson & Anderson, the Library Director and Trustees Evans and Osborn prepared the Library survey instrument.

Sixteen staff members returned the survey.

- 11 subscribe to the plan, 3 of whom include dependents.
- 5 do not subscribe to the plan.

The reasons given for not subscribing to the medical plan, in order of frequency were:

- 5 Cost of Co-Payment
- 3 Covered by spouse under another group plan
- 2 Inability to select physician
- 1 Eligible for Medicare

The reasons given by subscribers for not subscribing for dependents, in order of frequency was:

- 6 No dependents
- 2 Cost of Co-Payment
- 1 Dependent covered by another plan
- 1 Needs more information about costs

Seven respondents are not satisfied with the CareAmerica HMO Plan and four are satisfied.

Ten indicated a preference for an indemnity plan and four are not interested.

Of those interested in an indemnity plan five are not interested in paying more than \$20 per month for coverage, 2 are willing to pay and additional \$15 per month, 2 are willing to pay an additional

\$25 per month, and 1 is willing to pay an additional \$50 per month.

A copy of the summary of the responses to each question is attached.

President Dinsmore asked me to check with several other library districts about their medical benefits for staff:

Buena Park:

Pays full single coverage of any medical plan offered by PERS plus \$50 per month towards the family coverage. They also pay full dental for their employees and dependents. This costs the District up to \$400 per month per employee.

Altadena:

Pays full coverage for employees and dependents, medical and dental.

Palos Verdes:

Pays up to \$250 for coverage of employees and dependents on medical coverage, with employee paying coverage if a more expensive plan is selected. Dental is paid by the District in addition to the medical.

City of Placentia:

Pays full costs for employee and employee with one dependent. Employees with 2 or more dependents pay \$30 per month. Their program is self-funded with choice of 3 HMO's: Signa, FHP and Pacificare (most popular). Dental is provided in addition.

### BACKGROUND:

At its meeting on September 9, 1991, the Library Board authorized the Library Director to solicit bids for a three workstation office automation and desktop publishing project.

A "Notice Inviting Bids" was published in the Placentia News Times on November 14, 1991. The proof of publication is Attachment I.

Bid documents were also mailed to all computer equipment vendors with Placentia addresses in the Yellow Pages.

Bids were opened at 2:00 P.M. on Tuesday, December 3, 1991. Six bids were received as identified in Attachment 2

The bids were analyzed for errors and a conference was held with the low bidder to review the bid and the terms of the contract.

References from the low bidder were checked and found to be more than satisfactory.

While I have been planning to propose a workstation for the Children's Department for the FY1992-93 budget it might be feasible to consider adding it to the current contract. The additional cost would be \$3,150.

# **BACKGROUND:**

At its meeting on November 4, 1991, the Library Board of Trustees received the FY1990/91 Fiscal Audit from Anderson, Lynn, Bezich, Munson and Cronick Accountancy Corporation of Fullerton, California.

The reportable conditions noted are as follows:

The absence of account balances that are not a part of County of Orange general ledger, including County Exempt Funds Account, Friends of the Library Account and Investments.

The absence of a summary of activity in the accounts not on County of Orange general ledger.

Inadequate tracking of grant expenditures.

Establishing a general ledger and accounting system for all District funds handled outside the County of Orange general ledger will require the assistance of accounting professionals. Ideally something could be set up on either existing or custom computer software. Several such programs were demonstrated in the exhibits at the California Special Districts Association Annual Conference in Sacramento.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

- 1) To receive and file the FY1990/91 Fiscal Audit.
- To authorize the Library Director to solicit proposals from local certified public accounting firms to establish a general ledger and accounting system for all District funds handled outside the County of Orange general ledger.

materials for parent and homework centers at La Jolla

# BACKGROUND:

On November 4, 1991, I met with City of Placentia Human Services Director Betty Escobosa to discuss the possibility/feasibility of having the Library provide support materials at 2 locations in Placentia for use by the Human Services's staff in providing homework and parenting assistance.

At some time the Library had collections in several community centers but they haven't been active for several years.

In response to Ms. Escobosa's request I suggested that the Library could provide collections of appropriate paperback materials that would be circulated and controlled by the Human Services staff at each site. The Library would select and process the materials (reinforcement of spines and property stamps) and the City would provide shelving and staff to assist the students with their homework and use of the collection.

I suggested a start-up cost of \$1,000 per collection. We discussed the need to have some of the matérials, especially for the parent collections, in Spanish. Ms. Escobosa agreed to assist with the selection of appropriate Spanish language titles.

I estimate the annual upkeep cost to be \$500 per collection.

I also suggested that it would be helpful to have a set of World Book Encyclopedias at each site. These cost approximately \$700 per set.

Ms. Escobosa and I also discussed having the Human Services staff at the homework centers bring the students to the Library on the Placentia Trolley so that the Children's and Young Adult Librarians can provide library instruction.

# Page 2

On November 15, 1991, I met with City Manager Robert D'Amato to discuss the project. He would like the Library Board to approve it in concept and then explore the possibility of seeking grant funding to handle the personnel costs. Mr. D'Amato would like the Library to serve as project coordinator rather than the City's Human Services Staff. These details need to be more fully developed.

Perhaps the leaders of the communities served by these resource centers could convince the Orange County Supervisor to appropriate sufficient Special District Augmentation Funds to cover the costs of staffing and supplying these outreach projects into the Hispanic communities

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Approve the project in concept and authorize the Library Director to continue discussion with the City Manager and his staff for implementation at the soonest possible date. Mayor
