California Library Legislative Day - May 6, 1997

Library Legislative Day 1997 was sponsored by California Library Association (CLA) and California School Library Association (CSLA). After registration and introductions by the presidents of these organizations, Gregg Atkins (CLA) and Susan Choi (CSLA), there was a keynote speaker and a presentation from CSLA to Senator Cathy Wright. Next, legislators' packets which had not yet been claimed by volunteers were distributed. On this day every legislator in the California legislature receives an attractive folder which contains information about the various bills which the two organizations sponsor because they are most needed by California Libraries.

Before we left the Sacramento Convention Center for our pre-arranged appointments with our legislators we received an extensive briefing by our two legislative advocates, Mike Dillon (CLA) and Jeff Frost (CLSA). Both are very knowledgeable, well informed advocates who are excellent at their jobs. They emphasized key points in the flyers which were contained in our packets which we had all received earlier in the meeting. Mike Dillon briefly went over the chart which explains how a bill becomes a law.

The bills which we were interested in concerned the Educational Revenue Augmentation Fund (ERAF) and the Public Library Fund (PLF). In addition to these bills we received flyers on bills which our local delegation did not emphasize in our conversations with Assemblyman Dick Ackerman (72nd District) and Senator John Lewis (33rd District). These were SB409, Library of California, which is receiving a lot of attention and SB154, the sales tax bill.

Included in our packets were rosters, CLA Facts, a list of local eateries, a guide to the State Capitol, the chart describing the route a bill takes through the California legislature, plus flyers for the school librarians use.

We visited Assemblyman Ackerman before our lunch in the Capitol Basement Cafeteria. He is always very warm, friendly, and receptive. He seems to favor ACA4 as a means of reversing the property tax shift. After lunch we went to our appointment with Senator Lewis. He was much more amenable than in years past. We wondered if this was because the State's improving economy made him realize he didn't have to be so reluctant to help libraries.

Our legislative delegation was ably headed by Carol Ann Tassios, Director of the Yorba Linda Public Library. There were three trustees, two from Yorba Linda and myself. There were four or five school librarians from Esperanza High, Anaheim and Fullerton. May task was to speak about ERAF.

I also visited Senator Craven from the Riverside area. He has always been very friendly and kind to me in the past. My purpose was to thank him for his efforts on our behalf. His bill is SB880 and is similar to Aguiar's AB1. Both bills would freeze the amount at 1996-1997 levels and gradually return the property tax revenues that are annually transferred to ERAF.


At the end of the day there was a debriefing session. It was interesting to me that there were differing opinions as to the fate of ERAF. The delegation who spoke to Cruz Bustamante, the Speaker of the Assembly, said he felt the emphasis on welfare reform would mean that ERAF bills would be postponed. Other delegates received more optimistic opinions. We certainly need to continue pushing and should not slack off on our efforts to obtain more money in PLF and reimbursement for the dollars we lost in the property tax shift.







In 1992-93 and 1993-94, the State shifted about \$4 billion in property taxes from local government to meet their education budget requirements. These actions allowed the State to reduce the General Fund spending on schools and did not affect California's overall level of school spending. These shifts helped solve the State's budget imbalances in the early 1990's, but took millions of dollars away from city and county public libraries. There are a number of bills before the Legislature which would reverse or modify the property tax shifts. The table below outlines some possible options; combinations are possible. Please consider options which reverse all or part of the shifts.

OPTIONS:

Freeze	AB1 - Aguiar SB880 - Craven	Freezes the amount at 1996-97 levels. Gradual return to counties and local governments of property tax revenues that are annually transferred to ERAF.	
	ACA4 - Aguiar/Sweeney	Same content but as a constitutional amendment. Could be placed on statewide ballot by legislature; avoids Governor's veto.	
Return	AB95 - Sweeney/Aguiar	Provides for a gradual return of ERAF base amount to counties and local governments using an as yet to be determined formula.	





CLA Facts

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PUBLIC LIBRARY FUND

BACKGROUND:

The legislation authorizing the Public Library Fund (PLF) became effective July 1, 1983. The total cost of the program in its first year was \$12 per capita with localities paying 90% and the State authorized to pay 10%.

At the highest State appropriation for the PLF in 1989/90, the State provided \$20.6 million, approximately 55% of the amount required for full funding at that time. In his final year in office, with the State beginning to face budget difficulties, Governor Deukmejian reduced the PLF to \$16 million. The following year, Governor Wilson reduced it to \$10 million. The next year, he reduced it even further to \$8.87 million which was only 17% of the \$50.8 million required for full funding. Last year, through an exhaustive lobbying and grass roots effort, PLF was increased to \$15.87 million.

This year, we are continuing our efforts to get full funding for PLF which would be \$52,862,621. 1.94 per capita 100 58 the same as little as 30+

The Public Library Fund is part of the Governor's budget.

LEGISLATURE'S POLICY:

In passing the measure, the California Legislature found and declared "that it is in the interest of the people and of the State that there be a general diffusion of information and knowledge through the continued operation of free public libraries." The Legislature further declared that "the public library is a supplement to the formal system of free public education. . .and a resource for continuing education and re-education beyond the years of formal education and as such deserves adequate financial support from government at all levels."

AB345 GRANLUND

This bill would revise the existing formula so that PLF monies would be distributed on a per capita basis once funding reaches a level that holds all libraries harmless from reductions to their current allocation. It would aid those libraries which receive a low PLF amount because their local budgets don't meet per capita expenditures as set forth in current law.



BACKGROUND:

This Agenda Item was carried forward from the May 20, 1997 Agenda with the addition of establishing a procedure and calendar for future performance evaluations for the Library Director.

Salary History

The Library Director was appointed on August 19, 1991 at a salary of \$60,000.

A merit increase of 8.3% was awarded in March 1992 for a salary of \$65,000.

A 4.2% COLA was awarded in July 1992 to all staff. The Library Director was included for a salary of \$67,730.

The Library Director declined all discussion of a merit increase in Fiscal Year 1992-1993 because of the severe budget cuts and pending staff layoffs.

The 3% COLA granted to staff effective January 1, 1994 did not include the Library Director.

A merit increase of 4.5% was awarded in March, 1994, which when adjusted for the COLA granted to the staff in January, 1994 provided a net merit increase of 1.5% for a salary of \$70,800.

A 1.8% COLA was awarded in July 1994 to all staff. The Library Director was included for a salary of \$72,072.

A 3% COLA was awarded in July 1995 to all staff. The Library Director was included for a salary of \$74,234.

In June 1996, the Library Director declined the Board's offer to discuss a merit increase because of the continuing revenue shortfalls of the District and the condition of the book budget.

A 2% COLA was awarded in July 1996, to all staff. The Library Director was included for a salary of \$75,720.

The minimum staff COLA for Fiscal Year 1997-1998, as stipulated in the Memorandum of Understanding, will be 2%. If the Library Director is included, the change for the current salary will be approximately \$1,514 for a total of \$77.234.

Any change based upon merit will need to be followed up next month with a Resolution amending the Exempt Employees Salary Schedule.

Proposed Procedure and Calendar for Library Director Performance Evaluations

- Forms will be distributed to Trustees and the Library Director at the February Library Board Meeting. They are to be completed and returned to the Library Board President within twenty-one days of distribution.
- Library Board President will prepare and present a summary of the Evaluations and comments, and present them to the Trustees in a Closed Session at the March Library Board Meeting. At this time, only the evaluation will be discussed. The issue of compensation will not be addressed until after the Library Board President has met with the Library Director.
- Following the March Library Board Meeting, the Library Board President will meet with the Library Director to present and discuss the evaluation. During this meeting the Library Board President will request the Library Director's comments on salary and other compensation issues.
- At the April Board Meeting the Library Director's salary and compensation package will be discussed and action taken on any changes proposed. Changes or modifications to the Library Director Performance Review document for the next review year will be made at this meeting.
- At the May Library Board Meeting the Salary Schedule for Exempt Employees will be amended by Resolution to formalize any actions taken by the Board at its April Board Meeting.

There are three areas of concern for the issue of Library revenues:

1. Property Tax

Attachment A is a history of the District's property tax revenues since Fiscal Year 1990-1991.

Only three things can impact the property tax revenues:

- > Significant increase in property valuations
- Reversal of ERAF
- > Voter-approved local library tax

2. State Funds

Attachment B is a history of State funding.

Three issues are important to rebuilding the State revenues:

- > Legislative and gubernatorial approval of full funding of the Public Library Fund (PLF)
- Legislative and gubernatorial approval of full funding of Transaction Based Reimbursements (TBR) at a realistic cost of providing those services
- Avoiding dilution of the limited funds available to public libraries by sharing them with the academic, school and special libraries (SB409)

3. Local Revenues

Attachment C shows the decline in local revenues. These declines are mostly related to the decrease in circulation, which is directly linked to the decrease in the book budget and the subsequent unavailability of new items for circulation.

California Special Districts Association LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

June 5, 1997

Assembly Bill 556 by Assembly Member Curt Pringle, relating to the consolidation of special districts in Orange County, passed the Assembly yesterday (June 4, 1997) on a 52-to-8 vote, with 20 members not voting.

When the bill was presented early yesterday afternoon, the bill received only 23 votes. In addition to CSDA's opposition and that of the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA), the bill is strongly opposed by a number of public employee unions that represent employees at a number of the districts cited in the legislation. The unions concentrated their opposition on Assembly Democrats, not one of which voted for the bill.

When the call was lifted early last evening, the bill received 52 votes. including 20 Democrats.

It is believed that Mr. Pringle will continue to accept amendments in the Senate necessary to allow AB 556 to reach the Governor's desk. It is also believed that he will attempt to modify the bill in a manner which removes labor's opposition and that of one or two specified districts cited in the bill who have retained lobbyists to oppose the measure.

Localities See Some Hope for Justice on Property Taxes

An overdue momentum is building in Sacramento

A powerful group of business

There's more to a healthy California economy than a constant stream of tax breaks to induce businesses to move here or stay here. That fact was evident this week when a powerful group of business organizations gave enthusiastic support to a legislative initiative to begin returning state-appropriated property tax revenues to local government.

Private business wants good streets, water supplies, sewers, libraries, parks and police and fire protection. Those services are vital to busi-

ness operations as well as to the lifestyles and satisfaction of employees. But the sad story of recent years has been one of cuts in city and county services because of lack of

A state Chamber of Commerce official said that the pending legislation to restore property taxes to local governments "is crucial from an

economic development standpoint." Spokesmen for the residential and commercial construction industries delivered similar views.

By joining with cities, counties and special districts, the business groups have helped to create a seemingly unstoppable political force favoring an end to the state's usurpation of \$3.5 billion in local revenues annually. Under legislation signed by Gov. Pete Wilson, the state appropriated the money to itself in the early 1990s when it faced a multibillion-dollar budget deficit caused by the recession.

The recession is over now. State revenues are surging. But the state is still spending the local governments' money-including the annual growth in the property tax take—to balance its own budget. It's time for that to stop. The coalition is supporting legislation by Assemblyman

Michael Sweeney (D-Hayward) and Fred Aguiar (R-Chino) to cap the transfer of local funds at its current level and then to reduce the state's take by a certain percentage each year until it reaches zero.

Their measures (AB 95 and ACA 4) won the backing of the Assembly Appropriations Committee this week and will become an integral part of the state budget negotiations expected to begin soon.

A similar bill sponsored by Aguiar breezed through the Legislature last year but was vetoed by the governor. Wilson said then that "a comprehensive approach should be considered next year as a part of the budget process." But there was no such proposal in the governor's budget, and his Finance Department said this week it opposes the plan.

The devil is in the details of

the budget. The money to ensure a balanced budget, which is required under California law. has to come from somewhere. One place is the pot of several hundred millions that Wilson set aside for successive 5% business tax cuts this year and next. Democratic leaders in both houses of the Legislature insist there will be no such cut this year. This is money that rightfully should be returned to local government, backers of the Sweeney-Aguiar bills argue.

What California ultimately needs is a sweeping constitutional reform of the fiscal relationship between the state and the 7,000 units of local government. It has become an irrational mess over the past 25 years. Until a formula to do that is devised, the best way to begin restoring property tax revenues to local government

is the Sweeney-Aguiar plan.

Trustee commitments, apart from the Library Board Meetings, will also be shared to the fullest extent possible. These include, but are not limited to:

- Independent Special Districts of Orange County (ISDOC) quarterly evening meetings, once a year there is a NOON luncheon meeting.
- Local Area Formation Commission (LAFCO) Nominating Committee District must be represented by its President or another delegate who has been appointed by formal Resolution of the Board. This body meets only when there is a vacancy for the Special District representatives on LAFCO. These meetings are sometimes held at the same time as ISDOC.
- Orange County Investment Pool (OCIP) Bankruptcy Committee meetings are usually held during the day and are informational in nature. If votes are required they are presented at Board Meetings. This group met frequently during the first two years of the Bankruptcy. If future meetings are called, they will probably deal with the third party litigations (Merrill Lynch, etc.). These meetings are usually held in Irvine or Fountain Valley, and the advance notice is often short. It is at these meetings that we get first hand briefings from the Committee's Attorney (Patrick Shea), and the CPAs.
- > California Special Districts Association (CSDA) Annual Conference and Legislative Day.
- > CSDA Worker's Compensation Authority Board of Directors 4 meetings per year, including one at the CSDA Annual Conference.
- California Association of Library Trustees and Commissioners (CALTAC/CLA) Spring workshop for all Trustees and an Annual Conference (part of California Library Association Conference).
- ➤ Placentia Chamber of Commerce monthly breakfast meetings, includes time for visiting with community leaders and owners/managers of small businesses and a presentation by a speaker, 7:15 8:30 A.M.
- Placentia Chamber of Commerce monthly mixers, includes time for visiting with community leaders and owners/managers of small businesses, 5:30 7:00 P.M. The time is very flexible, like an open house, and one can come and go as needed.
- ➤ Placentia Library Foundation Board of Directors 4 Board meetings per year plus active committee assignments. Two Board delegates to the Foundation are elected by the Trustees at the Board's Annual Meeting each December.
- Friends of Placentia Library Board of Directors 10 Board meetings per year, currently rotated among Trustees.

BACKGROUND:

Each year local jurisdictions are required to establish an Appropriations Limitation (Gann Limit) for the next fiscal year.

The growth factor for Placentia Library District is calculated using price and population data provided by the California Department of Finance. This growth factor, when applied to the District's 1996-97 limit, produces its 1997-98 limit.

Calculation of Placentia Library District's Appropriations Limit for 1997-1998:

Take the **price factor** (the percentage change in California per capita personal income over prior year, as provided by the California Department of Finance, expressed as a ratio): 4.67% (4.67+100)/100=1.0467;

Multiply it by the **population change factor** for the City of Placentia as provided by the State Department of Finance, pursuant to Government Code Section 7901 and Revenue and Taxation Code Section 2228, expressed as a ratio: .96% (.96+100)/100 = 1.0096;

The Library's FY 1996-97 Gann Limit was \$1,752,223.

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

BACKGROUND:

The Memorandum of Understanding between the District and its Employees, approved by the Library Board on July 18, 1995, provides for an increase equal to the percent rise to the nearest tenth (0.1) of one percent, in the cost-of-living for the period March 1996 to March 1997 as measured by the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index "All Items" (base 1982-84), for the Los Angeles-Anaheim-Riverside area except, however, that such wage increase shall not be less than two (2) percent, nor more than five (5) percent for all classifications represented by the Association.

The Index, Attachment A, reported a cost of living change for the period March 1996 to March 1997 of 1.6%.

The amount applied to the Salary Schedule was the 2% minimum for all classifications except Pages. The adjustment for Pages reflects the minimum wage adjustments required by the State of California.

BACKGROUND:

The abundance of literature written about the Internet use and abuse in libraries across the Country, the State survey of how libraries across California are dealing with this new service, and this Library's own experience with the Internet use, have been reasons enough for the staff to think of proposing the attached Internet User Policy as a proactive, protective measure against any future problems.

The staff has written, studied and revised this document to provide the community with the best service and the Library with the adequate protection.

A sign-up sheet will be provided to insure equitable availability to all users. It will also be used for statistical purposes. Users will be asked to read the Use Policy and initial the sign-up sheet before using the terminals.

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt policy effective May 21, 1997

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USE POLICY FOR THE ELECTRONIC REFERENCE SERVICES

Proposed May 20, 1997

Electronic Reference Resources, including the Internet, are services provided by the Placentia Library District in fulfillment of it's mission of providing materials and services that satisfy the educational and informational needs of the community.

- Users of these services are required to sign-in at the Reference Desk. This will insure equitable availability of time.
- Each patron is guaranteed 30 minutes of uninterurupted use per session, and will be given a 10 minute notice if another patron is waiting.
- When ALL terminals are being used and a patron signs-in, he/she will be told which terminal he/she may use. If a patron giving up a terminal still needs to use one, he/she is required to sign-in again for the next available terminal.
- When available, children under 12 years of age will be assigned terminals located in the Children's Department and adults will be assigned terminals located in the Adult Services Department.
- No more than two people per terminal.
- Printing is available by using a debit card that may be purchased from a vending machine or borrowed from the Circulation Desk.
- E-Mail services, chat rooms and downloading of materials from the Internet are not allowed.

Programming- Children's Storytimes continued through the month of April. Six storytimes were performed with 86 children and 17 adults attending. April 17th was the last storytime scheduled for the spring 1997 session.

Ceremony recognizes 39 volunteers for their hours of service

lacentia's "stars" of the library galaxy were honored at the library's annual ceremony, in recognition of National Library Week.

Volunteers with 50-plus hours of service, local authors and "celebrity" readers enjoyed an evening of literature readings and received certificates April 16 from Libaray Director Elizabeth Minter.

Volunteers were not the only ones honored. Anita Godwin and Bev Johnson were designated director emeritus for their vears of dedication to the li-

Godwin was recognized for being a member of the board of directors for the Placentia Library District since the board's beginning, 27 years ago. Godwin also organized the Great Books Discussion Club. Johnson was recognized for being a board member of 10 years and holding successful fund-raisers.

Seven Placentia authors shared excerpts from their writings and were honored for their achievements in writing both fiction and non-fiction for adults and children.

Each of authors, many of whom are retired teachers, received a certificate and was publicly acknowledged and applauded by the audience.

"If people were not inspired to sit down and share their knowledge and insights, we wouldn't have libraries," Minter said. "The books on the shelves in our library don't come from mysterious places, they come from people. Real people who come from hometowns like ours, Placentia.'

Art Therapy Helped Son; Others Next


When Chris Johnson first dipped a brush into a pool of purple paint and dragged it across a piece of paper six years ago, he discovered another way besides a smile to communicate his feelings.

The disabled 22-year-old, who relies on his mother and a digital voice machine to verbalize his thoughts, now uses broad brush strokes and bright colors to provide others with a window into his mind.

His brilliantly colored watercolor and acrylic creations, which usually include his favorite colors rose and purple, also have begun to make a name for Johnson in communities around his Yorba Linda home.

Johnson's recent 14-piece show at the Placentia Library captured the attention of the City Council, which thanked him earlier this month for "bringing a breath of springtime" into the building with two tickets to Disneyland and a certificate.

One of his pieces will also be on display later this month in Main-Place/Santa Ana mall as part of the Imagination Celebration stu-



dent artwork exhibit

His mother, Kathy Johnson, added that she's working on getting a few of his paintings installed in the children's section of Bowers Museum in Santa Ana.

The George Key School special needs student, who will graduate in June, spends one morning a week learning new techniques in an Esperanza High School art class and constantly paints at home, his mother said. Like cloud formations, everyone sees something different in Johnson's paintings.

Esperanza art teacher Sandra Keil said she isn't surprised by the attention Johnson's work has

drawn.
"He has a wonderful sense of color and there's a real sponta-neity in his work," said Keil, who encouraged Johnson to join her class. "Things aren't overworked in his paintings. He'll sign his name and you'll know he's done. Although Johnson's mother is

excited about his displays, she's also thrilled about the positive experience he has in the class.

"He loves it, just his reaction when I say, "It's time to come to Mrs. Keil's class' shows it," she said, watching her son sprinkle salt over a watercolor to give it a rained-on effect.

Johnson's enthusiasm for the

class prompted his parents to work on establishing an art therapy center for disabled students in the area. Through grassroots fund-raisers, the Johnsons and about 20 other local parents have raised \$34,000 of the nearly \$45,000 needed to start Creative Options and Diversity of the

The program, which would receive state funding for operations, would offer arts training for North County disabled

students over the age of 18. Kathy Johnson said.


Kathy Johnson, who hopes to see the program in place by January, said she would like other students to have the same opportunity to develop their tai-


