III. Financial Report

A. Statement

1. There is \$4,721.96 in the ISDOC checking account.

IV. November 30, 2000 Quarterly Meeting

A. Noticing for Meeting

1. The telephone trees appear to be out of date and should not be used.

2. After some discussion, the best method to notify individuals of the meeting would be through flyers.

3. The flyers should include a deadline date for making reservations. (\$12.00 with a reservation and \$15.00 without a reservation).

B. Nominating Committee

- 1. The nominating committee (Phil Anthony, absent; Bob Hanson and Russ Paris) proposed the following slate of officers.
 - a. Mary Eileen Mathis President
 - b. Arlene Schaffer 1st Vice President
 - c. Larry Dick 2nd Vice President
 - d. Trudy Ohlig-Hall 3rd Vice President
 - e. Joan Finnegan Treasurer
 - f. Mike Dunbar Secretary
- 2. The slate of officers would be presented at the 11/30/00 meeting. Other nominees would be accepted from the floor. The President of each Board of Directors or his/her designee is the only eligible voter.

C. Program

- 1. Several ideas/issues were suggested for the program.
- 2. A recap of the election results and the energy deregulation issue were most prevalent issues.
- 3. State Senator/Assembly Member Bill Campbell would be invited to speak. He may be in line for a leadership position next term. He could also provide an update on the Little Hoover Commission Report.
- 4. Assemblymember Ken Maddox could also be invited as he is on the energy deregulation commission.
- 5. Energy deregulation issues may have similar undertones for the water industry in the future.

V. LAFCO Report

A. Special District Representative

- 1. Doug Reinhart has indicated that he will be relocating to Irvine and thus not be eligible for the El Toro Water District Board and a LAFCO representative.
- 2. If Doug Reinhart were to resign by December 2, 2000 (day after new directors would be sworn in), then ISDOC would need to fill that position.
- 3. The vote on a new LAFCO representative would be at a later date (after November 30, 2000 meeting) due to election representation bylaws. The bylaws will be distributed to the member agencies for review of the requirements.
- 4. During the coming year, the Vice Chair of LAFCO is scheduled during to be one of the special district representatives.

B. El Toro Water District

1. LAFCO will be proposing a study of various alternatives related to El Toro Water District.

2. Affected agencies and cities have been given notice of the proposed study.

C. Unincorporated Inlands

- 1. LAFCO staff will be heavily involved with the unincorporated island issue.
- 2. A sphere of influence update would be conducted for the City of Yorba Linda and the City of Laguna Beach, among others.

D. November 8, 2000 Meeting

- 1. The El Toro Water District scope of study is on the agenda.
- 2. A subcommittee (Arlene Schaffer is a member) has been formed to study the impacts of AB2838 (Hertzberg Bill).
- 3. The O.C. LAFCO staff will be attending a workshop at Cal LAFCO on AB2838. A workshop would then be held in Orange County, probably in the spring of 2001. It was requested that the workshop be conducted before agencies adopt their budgets for 2001/2002.

VI. CSDA

A. Planning/Board Meeting

1. A planning/board meeting is scheduled for December 7, 2000 in Napa, CA.

B. Conference 2001

Arlene Schaffer has been selected to serve as conference chairperson for 2001.

VII. Legislation

A. AB2838 Hertzberg

- 1. There will be several workshops held over the next few months to discuss the impacts of AB2838. This is the latest LAFCO reform legislation.
- 2. Cal LAFCO will hold a workshop for LAFCO staff at the end of November. O.C. LAFCO is scheduling a workshop for the spring of 2001.
- 3. Special districts need to stay involved as the funding mechanism changes under AB2338: 1/3 county, 1/3 cities and 1/3 special districts.

B. Proposed Cleanup to AB2338

- 1. Keith Coolidge discussed several areas that would be reviewed for cleanup to AB2838.
- 2. These areas would include the following:
 - a. LAFCO could not change the boundaries of a special district without its consent.
 - b. The water rights of a special district would remain with the State Water Resources Control Board and not LAFCO.

VIII. Other Matters

A. Water Wheeling

- 1. Santa Margarita Water District completed a 2000 acre foot water wheeling proposal with mixed results.
- 2. Of the 2000 acre foot, approximately ½ was "lost" due to a Delta carrying charge (water allocated to the environment).
- 3. The remaining water was not actually delivered due to the unavailability of capacity in the State Water Project. There was a very short three day window that was missed.

B. Public Relations

1. A suggestion was made to send out a congratulatory note to the successful candidates of the November 7, 2000 election.

C. MWD Rate Structure

- 1. MWD is in the process of developing a new rate structure.
- 2. There would be a basic two-tier system. The actual components that would constitute the rate are approximately nineteen.
- 3. The MWD Board will be discussing these components the next several months.

We have audited the general purpose financial statements of Placentia Library District, for the year ended June 30, 2000, and have issued our report thereon dated September 20, 2000.

We have conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and the State Controller's Minimum Audit Requirements for California Special Districts. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement.

In planning and performing our audit of the general purpose financial statements of Placentia Library District, for the year ended June 30, 2000, we considered its internal control structure in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the general purpose financial statements and not to provide assurance on the internal control structure.

The management of Placentia Library District is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of internal control structure policies and procedures. The objectives of an internal control structure are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Because of inherent limitations in any internal control structure, errors or irregularities may nevertheless occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of the structure to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the effectiveness of the design and operation of policies and procedures may deteriorate.

For the purpose of this report, we have classified the significant internal control structure policies and procedures in the following categories of cash and investments, payroll, accounts payable and cash disbursements, cash receipts and general ledger.

For all of the control categories listed above, we obtained an understanding of the design of relevant policies and procedures and whether they have been placed in operation, and we assessed control risk.

We noted certain matters involving the internal control structure and its operation that we consider to be reportable conditions under standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Reportable conditions involve matters coming to our attention relating to significant deficiencies in the design or operation of the internal control structure that, in our judgment, could adversely affect the entity's ability to record, process, summarize, and report financial data consistent with the assertions of management in the general purpose financial statements.

Fixed Asset Account Group

Absence of a fixed asset listing.

A material weakness is a reportable condition in which the design or operation of the specific internal control structure elements does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that errors or irregularities in amounts that would be material in relation to the general purpose financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions.

Our consideration of the internal control structure would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control structure that might be reportable conditions and, accordingly, would not necessarily disclose all reportable conditions that are also considered to be material weaknesses as defined above. However, we believe none of the reportable conditions described above is a material weakness.

This report is intended for the information of the Board of Trustees and management. This restriction is not intended to limit the distribution of this report, which is a matter of public record.

The overall objective for the Placentia Library Literacy Services (PLLS) is to recruit, train, and match more than 100 volunteer tutors during FY 2000-2001. To do this, PLLS will

- •Continue to use flyers, the local cable, and the library activity calendar to encourage participation in the literacy program.
- •Conduct tutor training workshops monthly.
- •List tutor training workshops in the Placentia City quarterly newsletter and in the Placentia Chamber of Commerce quarterly newsletter.
- Present literacy at local community service organizations.
- Update volunteer job descriptions with the Volunteer Center of Orange County.
- B. Register and test adult learners.

PLLS does not have to recruit adult learners because there is usually a waiting list of learners and more learners than tutors. PLLS does register and test all learners so they are placed and ready to start when matched.

C. Matching.

The PLLS objective for FY 2000-2001 is to match more than 100 volunteer tutors with more than 100 learners. PLLS also plans to

- •Continue to match pairs based on schedules, geography, and the expressed preferences of tutors/learners.
- Attempt to match each student within 45 days of his/her application.
- •Conduct monthly learner list review for updating priority matching.
- D. Support of tutors and learners.

PLLS plans to support tutors and learners by

• Sending tutors to the SCLLN Tutor Conference.

- •Updating curriculum and acquiring new material, as needed, such workbooks, books-on-tape, and computer software.
- •Participating in the Annual Meeting of the Friends of the Library, and recognizing tutors and learners.

E. Community Outreach.

PLLS's objective is to be extremely visible in the community and to encourage community participation in the literacy program. PLLS plans to

- •Participate in local community events, such as Placentia Heritage Day (October), the Placentia Chamber Business Expo (April), and the Placentia Open House (May).
- Provide programs to local community service organizations and other groups.
- Submit regular press releases regarding PLLS events and achievements.
- Participate in joint ventures with SCLLN, such as the Orange County Fair.

F. Planning and evaluation.

PLLS's main objective is to provide a literacy program in FY 2000-2001 that is relevant and efficient. PLLS will

- •Provide tutor training workshop evaluations and use them to assess the validity of the training.
- •Monitor the tutor matches and tutoring hours through monthly volunteer reports and by telephone. Submit a monthly report to the Placentia Library District Board of Trustees.
- •Complete a CALPEP form on all adult students. PLLS will periodically check to see how learners are achieving their goals.
- Complete and submit a semi-annual and an annual CLC report.

2. The following is a breakout of the line items in the budget summary.

- A. Line 1., Personnel: \$3,000. These funds will be used for staff to outreach at local community centers.
- B. Line 3b, Travel: \$1,000. These funds will be used for the annual SCLLN Conference and for travel to other literacy meetings.
- C. Line 3c, Office Supplies: \$7,618. These funds will be used for a variety of office supplies and to purchase office furniture for the literacy tutoring area.
- D. Line 3e, Instructional Resources: \$5,000. These funds will be used to purchase workbooks for learners.
- E. Line 3f, Communications: \$1,200. These funds will be used for computers, telephones and postage.

This policy shall be accomplished by enabling libraries of all types and in all parts of the state to provide their users with the services and resources of all libraries in this state, and by assisting libraries to provide and improve services to the underserved.

Library of California Board Mission and Vision Statements:

Mission Statement: The Library of California Board builds and supports the sharing of resources among all libraries for all Californians.

Vision Statement: The Library of California Board will be the nationally recognized leader of a dynamic statewide system of quality library services.

To achieve the purpose of the Act, the following actions were taken at the Library of California Board meeting in Santa Clara on November 9-10, 2000:

Adoption of Agenda

1. It was moved, seconded (Fong/Kallenberg) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board adopts the agenda as modified.

Approval of Minutes

2. The draft minutes of the August 16-18, 2000 Library of California Board meeting were approved as modified.

Election of Board Officers for 2001

- 3. It was moved, seconded (Tuttle/Purucker) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board elects James R. Dawe as President of the Library of California Board for the year 2001.
- 4. It was moved, seconded (Wang/Calderon) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board elects Victoria F. Fong as Vice-President of the Library of California Board for the year 2001.

Regional Library Network Development continued

- 11. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board approves the 70 institutions included in Table 3 revised, Tierra del Sol Completed Charter Member Applications, and that the Board makes the determinations related to the exceptions for the Pomona Valley Hospital Medical Center as required under Regulations Section 20313 (b), and that these institutions be approved as charter members of the Tierra del Sol Regional Library Network effective immediately, and that state-funded member benefits for their participating libraries commence no sooner than January 1, 2001. (See Attachment B)
- 12. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried by a vote of 9 yeas and 1 abstention (Kallenberg) that the Library of California Board accepts the application of the Heartland Regional Library Network, as it meets all the legal requirements of the Library of California Act and Regulations, that the Network Area for this Network be established for the same geographical area as Planning Region 6, and that the Heartland Regional Library Network be established immediately and be approved to begin operations no sooner than January 1, 2001.
- 13. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried by a vote of 9 yeas and 1 abstention (Kallenberg) that the Library of California Board approves the 33 institutions included in Table 4 revised, Heartland Completed Charter Member Applications, as charter members of the Heartland Regional Library Network effective immediately, and that state-funded member benefits for their participating libraries commence no sooner than January 1, 2001. (See Attachment B)
- 14. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board approves the 35 institutions included in Table 5 revised, Cascade Pacific Completed Charter Member Applications, as charter members of the Cascade Pacific Library Network effective immediately, and that state-funded member benefits for their participating libraries commence no sooner than January 1, 2001. (See Attachment B)
- 15. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board approves the 29 institutions included in Table 6 revised, Golden Gateway Completed Charter Member Applications, as charter members of the Golden Gateway Library Network effective immediately, and that state-funded member benefits for their participating libraries commence no sooner than January 1, 2001. (See Attachment B)
- 16. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board approves the 19 institutions included in Table 7 revised, Gold Coast Completed Charter Member Applications, as charter members of the Gold Coast Library Network effective immediately, and that state-funded member benefits for their participating libraries commence no sooner than January 1, 2001. (See Attachment B)

Regional Library Network Membership

17. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board authorizes that membership applications that are completed and received by the Board by December 31, 2000 are eligible to receive member benefits and services during the current fiscal year upon approval of their applications at the February 2001 Library of California Board meeting, and that membership applications received after this date be considered for membership benefits during the following fiscal year.

Telecommunications Infrastructure

18. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board directs its Chief Executive Officer to allocate Library of California funds not to exceed \$75,000 to continue the Z39.50 Server Software grant program for 2000/2001.

CLSA Statewide Data Base Program

19. It was moved by the Support Services Committee (Kallenberg) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board directs its Chief Executive Officer to use up to \$148,140 of the remaining funds from the 2000/2001 CLSA Statewide Data Base allocation for grants to public libraries for enrichment or enhancement of catalog records.

Multitype Pilot Interlibrary Loan Program

- 20. It was moved by the Access Services Committee (Fong) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board directs its Chief Executive Officer to allocate 2000/2001 Library of California funds not to exceed \$300,000 to support the extension of the current interlibrary loan pilot program through June 30, 2001.
- 21. It was moved by the Access Services Committee (Fong) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board requires all libraries enrolled in the interlibrary loan pilot program to be a member or a participating library of a member of the Library of California, effective July 1, 2001.

CLSA Program Transitioning

22. It was moved by the CLSA Transition Committee (Spence) and carried unanimously that the Library of California Board directs its Chief Executive Officer to request an opinion from the Attorney General's Office on transition issues concerning CLSA Systems as identified in the Library of California Act and the California Library Services Act, to prepare reports to the Board on the progress of this request and the outcomes resulting from it; and that a subcommittee of the Board be charged to develop and submit specific questions on which an opinion will be sought.

Library of California Funding

- 23. It was moved, seconded (Spence/Purucker) and carried unanimously that Library of California Board authorizes the expenditure of \$2,527,000 to support partial implementation of LoC Regional Library Network Plans of Service. Expenditure of funds will be limited to the following program categories:
 - ♦ Reference and Information Services (Sect. 18846)
 - ♦ Delivery (Sect. 18842(c))
 - ♦ Training (Sect. 18845)
 - ♦ Administration including development and support of the network council (Sect. 18841)
 - ♦ Public Relations (Sect. 18847)
 - ♦ Telecommunications
 - ♦ Intraregional communications

Each regional library network shall receive the same base level of funding, \$361,000, in accordance with Article 7, section 18862 of the Library of California Act. Regional library networks shall allocate their funding so that all program categories are addressed and may not allocate their funding to any other program categories.

Exhibit 1

A. THREE YEAR GOAL: ACHIEVE FULL IMPLEMENTATION AND FUNDING OF THE LIBRARY OF CALIFORNIA ACT AND COMPLETE THE TRANSITION FROM CLSA

SIX MONTH STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES:

- 1. At the November 10, 2000 Board meeting, the Legislative Committee (Susan Steinhauser, Chair), with input from the Board and Bureau Chief Mark Parker, will present to the Board for consideration an education strategy for legislators, with supporting materials, to be used by Board members in legislative districts.
- 2. At the November 10, 2000 Board meeting, the Board, upon recommendation of the Library of California Support Services Committee (John Kallenberg, Chair) will decide upon a compensation model for the Regional Library Networks.
- 3. At the February 2001 Board meeting, the LoC Support Services (John Kallenberg, Chair) and LoC Access Services (Victoria Fong, Chair) committees will recommend to the Board for its consideration a compensation model for all programs included in the proposed funding for 2001-2002.
- 4. By February 28, 2001, each Board member will make at least one legislative contact, coordinated by the Legislative Committee, using the Library of California educational strategy.
- B. THREE YEAR GOAL: PROMOTE PUBLIC AWARENESS AND SUPPORT OF THE LIBRARY OF CALIFORNIA

SIX MONTH STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES:

- 1. By the November 10, 2000 Board meeting, Robert Daseler as lead and with Al Bennett, working with regional leaders, will send to statewide news services stories about LoC services which benefit patrons of the library.
- 2. By the February 2001 Board meeting, Jane Lowenthal and Bureau Chief Mark Parker will propose to the Board a process (including consideration of certificates of appreciation) for recognizing organizations and individuals for their achievements.
- 3. At the February 2001 Board meeting, Jane Lowenthal will explore the pros and cons and report to the Board on the creation of a Friends of the Library of California.
- 4. By the February 28, 2001, Jane Lowenthal, working with a region, will create an event/program which publicizes the LoC.
- C. THREE YEAR GOAL: IMPLEMENT REGIONAL AND STATEWIDE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

SIX MONTH STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES:

1. By November 10, 2000, the Board will establish policies to implement programs and services through the end of the 2000-2001 fiscal year.

- 2. At the November 10, 2000 Board meeting, the Board will allocate 2000-2001 funds for expenditure to implement programs and services.
- 3. By February 28, 2001, the Board, upon recommendation of the LoC Support Services Committee (John Kallenberg, Chair) will establish operating Regional Library Networks.

D. THREE YEAR GOAL: ESTABLISH AN EFFECTIVE BOARD

SIX MONTH STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES:

- 1. By September 30, 2000, each Board member will give to the Board President recommendations, based on qualifications in the LoC Act, for appointments to the Board.
- 2. By October 15, 2000, the Board President will meet with the appointing authorities or their representatives to encourage the prompt appointment of members to fill Board vacancies.
- 3. By the November 2000 Board meeting, each Board member will identify what training will be needed/helpful to become a more effective Board member and be prepared to discuss his/her needs at the meeting.
- 4. By the November 2000 Board meeting, the LoC Director will identify funds available for Board training.
- 5. At the November 2000 Board meeting, each committee chair will conduct a discussion with his/her committee on ways to improve communication at and between meetings, and between Board members and staff, and each chair will report the results at the Board meeting.
- 6. By December 15, 2000, the Board President will appoint, if needed, a working group of Board and staff to develop recommendations based on information from the committee/Board discussions for improved communications.
- 7. By December 15, 2000, each Board member will provide to the Board President and Vice President written comments on Board Committee structure.
- 8. By January 15, 2001, the Board President will appoint committee members to meet at the February 2001 Board meeting.
- 9. By the February 2001 Board meeting, the LoC Director will develop a training plan and present it to the Board for discussion.

The planning group decided to forward the draft objectives to all Board Members prior to formal adoption at the November 2000 Board meeting. The draft objectives were distributed to all Board Members with a request for their review, comment, and suggestions. A response was received from Board Member Susan Steinhauser and is included as Exhibit 2 below.

SUBJECT: Shared Funding of LAFCO Budget by County, Cities, and Special Districts Under New Law (AB 2838 – Hertzberg)

AB 2838 (Hertzberg) was signed by the Governor last month and will become statutory law effective January 1, 2001 as the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000. (A "blueline" version of the Act can be downloaded in PDF format from OPR's website: www.opr.ca.gov.) A major provision of the new law affecting Orange County independent special districts is the shared funding of LAFCO's budgetary costs by the County, all Orange County cities, and all Orange County independent special districts.

For your review, a brief summary of the shared funding provisions is provided below. (Also refer to the attached printout of Government Code §56381 from the above-mentioned "blueline" document.)

- **A.** By May 1, LAFCO adopts a proposed budget following a noticed public hearing.
- **B.** By June 15, LAFCO adopts a final budget following a noticed public hearing.
- C. LAFCO transmits its proposed and final budgets to:
 - the Board of Supervisors;
 - each city, and to the clerk and chair of the city selection committee;
 - each independent special district, and to the clerk and chair of the independent special district selection committee.
- **D.** After LAFCO adoption of a final budget, the auditor apportions the net operating expenses as follows:
 - 1. The County, cities, and independent special district provide a one-third share of LAFCO's operational costs.
 - 2. The auditor apportions the independent special districts' share amongst the districts in proportion to each district's revenues for general purpose transactions, as reported in the most recent edition of the "Financial Transactions Concerning Special Districts" published by the Controller, OR by an alternative method approved by a majority of the agencies representing a majority of their combined populations.

- E. After apportioning the costs, the auditor requests payment from the Board of Supervisors, each city, and each independent special district by no later than July 1 for the amount that entity owes and the actual administrative costs incurred by the auditor in apportioning costs and requesting payment from each entity.
- F. If the County, a city, or independent special district does not remit its required payment within 60 days, LAFCO may determine an appropriate method of collecting the required payment, including a request to the auditor to collect an equivalent amount from the property tax, or any fee or eligible revenue owed to the County, city, or district.
 - 1. The auditor must provide written notice to the County, city, or district before appropriating a share of the property tax or revenue to LAFCO for the payment due.
 - 2. Any expenses incurred by LAFCO or the auditor in collecting late payments or successfully challenging nonpayment will be added to the payment owed to LAFCO.

Plan Amendments For Premium Conversion Plan

The Premium Conversion Plan is amended effective for plan years beginning on or after January 1, 2001, in the following manner:

Article 2 Definitions is amended by adding the following:

"Dependent" means a person whose relationship to participant is described in Code Section 152, except that for purposes of health coverage, any child to whom Code Section 152(e) applies shall be treated as a dependent of both parents.

Article 3.5 is amended to 3.6.

Article 3.5 is amended to read: FMLA Leave.

A Participant who takes an unpaid leave of absence under the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 ("FMLA Leave") may revoke his or her election to participate under any group health insurance benefit offered under this Plan, for the remainder of the Plan Year in which such leave of absence commences. Such revocation shall be effected in accordance with such procedures as prescribed by the Plan Administrator. Upon such Participant's return from his or her FMLA Leave, the Participant may elect to be reinstated in the Plan, on the same terms that applied to the Participant prior to his or her taking the FMLA Leave, and with such other rights to revoke or change elections as are provided to other Participants under the Plan. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a Participant on FMLA Leave shall have no greater rights to benefits for the remainder of the Plan Year in which the FMLA Leave commences as other Plan Participants.

Article 4 Election of Benefits is amended by deleting in entirety Section 4.4 entitled Change in Family Status and substituting the following:

Once an Employee has elected Benefits and the Plan year has started, the Employee cannot amend or revoke the election unless there is a "Change in Status".

Change in Status means:

- A change in a Participant's legal marital status, including marriage, divorce, legal separation, annulment, or death of the Participant's spouse.
- An event affecting the number of Participant's Dependents, including birth, death, adoption, and placement for adoption.
- A change in employment status of the Participant, his spouse or Dependents, including termination or commencement of employment (as determined under the Code Section 125 regulations); a strike or lockout; a commencement of or return from and unpaid leave of absence; a change in worksite; or a change in the employment status of the Participant, his spouse or dependent (e.g., hourly to salary, union to non-union, or full-time to part-time), that affects that person's rights under this Plan or an underlying benefit program (e.g., changing from salaried to hourly-paid, union to non-union or part-time from full-time).
- An event that causes a Participant's Dependent to satisfy or cease to satisfy the eligibility requirements for a particular benefit, such as attaining a specified age or the Dependent's status as a student.
- A change in the residence of the Participant, his spouse or Dependent.
- Any other events included under Code Section 125 or regulations or other guidance promulgated thereunder relating to changes in status.

Revocation of a designation of Benefits and election of new Benefits may be made by an Employee, effective prospectively only for the remainder of the Plan Year, if both the revocation of existing designation of Benefits and election of new Benefits are made on account of the consistent with the previously described Change in Status. The revocation and/or new election must be made by the

Employee within 30 days of the Change in Status. Before the Plan Year has begun, an Employee may amend or revoke his or her designation of Benefits to the extent that the Employer may provide. Any new election shall be effective at such time as the Employer shall prescribe, but not later than the first pay period beginning after the modified election form is completed and returned to the Employer.

The Plan Administrator or a designated representative will review all requests for a change in a Employee's elections due to Change in Status and determine (a) if the indicated Change in Status is consistent with the definitions and guidelines and (b) if the request for such a change is accompanied by all required documentation.

Under all circumstances, the Plan Administrator reserves the right to request additional documentation.

Article 4.5 is amended to 4.6.

Article 4.5 is amended to read:

Revocation and Modification of Benefit Election. (a) Except as provided in this Section 4.5, before the Plan Year has begun, a Participant may modify or revoke his designation of Benefits to the extent that the Employer may provide. Any new election under this Section 4.5 shall be effective at such time as the Employer shall prescribe, but not later than the first pay period beginning after the modified election form is completed and returned to the Employer. Once an Eligible Employee has elected Benefits under the plan and the Plan Year has begun, he may not modify or revoke his election of Benefits, except on account of, and consistent with a Change in Status, or as otherwise provided in this Section 4.5.

(b) Change in Coverage.

• If benefit coverage under this Plan is significantly curtailed (as determined by the Plan Administrator in its sole discretion) or ceases during a plan year, the Participant may revoke his or her election under the Plan with respect to that coverage and may prospectively elect coverage under another plan that provides similar coverage. Coverage under a benefit plan is deemed "significantly curtailed" only if there is an overall reduction in coverage provided to Participants under the Plan so as to constitute reduced coverage to Participants in general.

- If during a Plan Year the Plan adds or eliminates a benefit, an affected Participant may elect a newly-added benefit, or elect another benefit where a benefit option has been eliminated, prospectively on a pre-tax basis by making corresponding election changes with respect to coverage with respect to the benefit option providing similar coverage.
- A Participant may make a prospective election change that is on account of and corresponds with a change made under the plan of the employer of the Participant's spouse, former spouse, or Dependent's employer, if (a) the cafeteria plan or benefit plan in which the spouse, former spouse, or Dependent participates permits its participants to make an election change that would be permitted under Treasury regulation 1.125-4(b) through (g); or (b) the Participant's plan year period of coverage is different from the plan year period of coverage under the cafeteria plan or benefit plan of the plan in which the spouse, former spouse or Dependent participates.
- If the Participant's share of premium increases or decreases during a Plan Year by a significant amount, then the appropriate benefit elections of the Participant shall be prospectively increased or decreased to reflect such change. If the Participant's share of the premium increases significantly during a Plan Year, then the participant may either make a corresponding prospective increase in his or her contributions or may revoke his or her election and in lieu thereof, receive coverage under another Plan option which provides similar coverage. Whether an increase or decrease in cost is significant or insignificant shall be determined by the Plan Administrator, on a reasonable and consistent basis, in accordance with prevailing IRS guidance, and based upon all the surrounding facts and circumstances (including, but not limited to, the dollar amount or percentage of the cost change).
- Where there is a judgement, decree, or order (including a qualified medical child support order described in ERISA Section 609) ("Order") resulting from a Participant's divorce, annulment, legal separation, or change in custody, (a) a Participant's election under an accident and health plan may be changed to provide coverage for a Dependent who is the Participant's child if the Order requires such coverage, and (b) coverage of the Dependent who is the Participant's child may be revoked or changed if the Order requires someone other than the Participant to provide such coverage.

- If a Participant, his spouse or Dependent who is enrolled in an accident or health plan of the Employer becomes entitled to Medicare or Medicaid (other than coverage consisting solely of benefits under Section 1928 of the Social Security Act providing for pediatric vaccines), then the Participant may prospectively reduce or cancel the accident or health coverage of the person becoming entitled to Medicare or Medicaid. If a Participant, spouse, or Dependent who has been entitled to Medicare or Medicaid loses eligibility for such coverage, then the Participant may prospectively elect to commence or increase the health or accident coverage.
- Where the Participant takes leave under the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993, the provisions of Section 3.5 shall apply.

A Participant entitled to make a new election under this Section 4.5 must do so within 30 days of the event described above. Any election shall apply for the balance of the Plan Year in which the election is made unless a subsequent event (described in this Section 4.5) occurs.

Delete Article 5.6. This is now covered in Article 4.5.

BACKGROUND

A Civic Center Authority Special Meeting was held on December 13, 2000 to discuss financing the exterior renovation plans for the Civic Center.

City Finance Director Steve Brisco presented several financing options for the District through the City. City staff has raised the starting point for the District's share of the project from \$271,170 to \$285,000. The additional \$13,830 has been added to Provision for Contingency, raising that percentage from 15% to 21% of the total project. The revised Civic Center Authority Cost Estimate is Attachment A.

No one from the City acknowledged or responded to the District's financing proposal, Attachment B, sent to the City Administrator on November 29, 2000.

If the City were to finance the District's share of the Civic Center Authority improvements it would charge 6.5%, the same amount that it earns on its investments. The cost of borrowing for the City is estimated to be 5.5%.

The District reported to the Civic Center Authority at its meeting on November 28, 2000 that it is not in a position to make major debt service payments until after the Library construction bonds are retired in Fiscal Year 2004-2005. This memo is Attachment C. (The District is planning to make balloon payments on the Energy Lease through Fiscal Year 2006-2007 but those payments, approximately \$24,000 per year, may be extended until the end of the lease period in 2114.)

If the District finances its share through the City, and if the District waits to begin repayment until the Energy Lease is repaid, and it the District repays the City loan at a rate of \$109,504.70 per year from Fiscal Year 2007-2008 through Fiscal Year 2010-2011, the total amount paid in interest would be:

Interest growth before repayment begins \$ 99,737

Interest during principal repayment period 108,034

TOTAL INTEREST \$ 207,771

I have asked Mr. Brisco to prepare an illustration based on a ten-year loan with both the City and District paying their pro-rata shares of the interest during the first five years of the loan, with the City repaying its share of the principal in the first five years, and the Library repaying its share of the principal (and 100% of the interest) in the second five years.

I am also asking the Special District Finance Authority for information on financing the District's portion with the first principal payment due in Fiscal Year 2006-2007. The principal repayment rate would be approximately \$100,000 per year since the District will also be paying on the Energy Lease.

The next meeting will be a joint meeting of the Library Board of Trustees and the City Council with the Civic Center Authority on Tuesday, January 16, 2001 at 5:30 P.M. at City Hall.

RECOMMENDATION

Give direction to Library Representatives for future action by the Civic Center Authority.

SUBJECT: Library Financing for Civic Center Improvements

As a follow-up to the discussion at the Placentia Civic Center Authority meeting on November 28, 2000 I would like to recommend the following:

- 1. That the California Special District Association Finance Authority be considered as a candidate for the lease. The contact is Bill Morton at 818-224-4787. He should recognize my name and certainly the name of the District. We have talked with him several times in the past but have not actually used the Authority's services. If I may be of assistance in any way please let me know.
- 2. That the City consider allowing the District to pay its share of the interest and processing fees for as long as the lease is active (approximately June 2006); and after the City has paid the lease, to allow the District to pay its share of the principal to the City no later than June 30, 2010, with no additional interest payments. This ensures that the District pays its share of the actual lease interest without the obligation becoming overly burdensome on the annual operating budget over an extended period of years. The District will have a built-in incentive to eliminate this debt as early as possible to permit major interior renovations that will need to be postponed until 2110.

I am glad to see this project moving forward. If there is anything that I may do to be of assistance please give me a call.

SUBJECT: Library Financial Status Regarding Debt Service

Placentia Library District is carrying a debt retirement obligation through Fiscal Year 2006-2007 that takes approximately 8% of its annual General Fund Budget. The District's General Fund Budget for Fiscal Year 2000-2001 is \$1,317,789 (not including carryovers) and the Debt Retirement is \$111,525. Attachment A shows the District's debt payment obligations in detail by fiscal year.

The balances in the District's reserve funds are not adequate to finance the Civic Center Authority project. They are used by the District to cover the operating budget in the General Fund until the first property tax receipts are available in December. The District's Fund Balance Report for November 15, 2000 is Attachment B.

The District's primary source of revenue is property tax, which accounts for approximately 85% of its general fund budget. The District does not receive any other taxes. The remaining operating funds consist of grants from the State Library of California and the Passport Agency revenues, all of which are restricted in use.

If the District develops any additional major financial obligations before Fiscal Year 2007-2008 it will be necessary to meet the payments by making reductions in public services.

BACKGROUND

At its meeting on April 10, 1998, the Library Board of Trustees, pursuant to several months of discussion, adopted a policy limiting the consecutive terms of Library Board officers to two (2) years. The Placentia Library District Board of Trustees Handbook, Revised April 10, 1998, is Attachment A.

Trustees Dinsmore and Wood requested that the Board review this policy at the November 15, 2000 Regular Board Meeting. Following discussion at that meeting it was the consensus that the item be included on the Agenda for the December 20, 2000 Regular Board Meeting.

RECOMMENDATION

Determine whether to continue the policy of limiting the consecutive terms of Library Board officers to two (2) years.

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PLACENTIA LIBRARY DISTRICT MISSION STATEMENT Adopted by the Library Board of Trustees June 15, 1992

To provide library services and materials that are responsive to the informational, recreational, educational, and cultural needs of all member of the community.

THE PURPOSE OF THE PLACENTIA LIBRARY DISTRICT IS TO:

- Acquire, organize and maintain a collection of print and non print materials to meet the informational, recreational, educational, and cultural reading, listening and viewing needs of the residents of the District and other eligible users.
- Provide qualified staff to assist the public with the use of the collection and the information contained therein.
- Provide and operate a library facility that is free of physical barriers, to house the
 collection and services, to provide reading and study space for users, and to provide
 space for library and community programs.
- Collect, preserve and maintain a collection of published and unpublished material
 about the City of Placentia and contiguous communities, about current and prior
 residents of Placentia, and published materials by authors who reside or have resided
 in Placentia.

PLACENTIA LIBRARY DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES HANDBOOK Revised April 10, 1998

I. DEFINITION AND HISTORY

A. <u>Definition of an Independent Special District</u>

Independent special districts are the most local form of government in the State of California. There are over 2,000 independent special districts in California. They provide many essential services to areas embracing both incorporated and unincorporated territories, sometimes within and sometimes across county boundaries.

In most cases independent special districts were organized by local citizens seeking solutions to their many service and utility problems. The independent special districts thus established created service areas not necessarily limited to, or encompassed by, the other political boundaries of existing cities and counties. In the case of the Placentia Library District there was neither a county library nor an incorporated city with which to affiliate when the District was established on September 2, 1919.

Today in the State of California there are five independent special library districts with exclusively elected boards, and five more special district libraries that use school board members as their governing body.

B. <u>History</u>

The Placentia Library District was formed in September 1919, pursuant to the Library District Act of 1909 (California State Education Code, Chapter Four (4), Sections 27501 through 27707).

Placentia Library District Board of Trustees Handbook, Revised April 10, 1998, Page 3.

In 1926, the board started its first non-storefront library located on the northwest corner of Bradford and Center. In 1927, they moved into the 4,500 square foot library. This building was designed by Carlton Monroe Winslow of Los Angeles. At that time, the population of the District was approximately 800 people.

September of 1974 saw the doors open to the present library at 411 East Chapman in the Civic Center. The District joined the City in a joint-powers authority to construct the 28,800 square foot structure to serve a growing population of 31,000 people.

In 1966, the Placentia Library District worked in conjunction with the Yorba Linda Library District and the Orange County Public Library to form the Santiago Library System.

In 1974, Santiago Library System, in conjunction with local universities and colleges, formed a network called Libraries of Orange County Network (LOCNET).

Membership in the System and Network provides an expanded source of books reference services, audiovisual and technical processing for all patrons. Autonomy is still maintained by each member library of the System.

Placentia Library District was the first public library in Orange County to sponsor and operate a literacy program for adults.

C. Administration

The Placentia Library District is governed by a five member elected Board of Trustees. The governing board promulgates policies and regulations for the District, as well as establishing the budget for tax rate.

Memberships are maintained for the District in the California Special Districts
Association (CSDA) and the Orange County Volunteer Center. Staff memberships
include the American Library Association (ALA), California Library Association (CLA),
Public Library Executives Association of Southern California (PLEASC), Southern
California Library Literacy Network (SCLLN), and the National Society of Fundraising
Executives (NSFRE).

II. BOARD MEMBERS ARE TRUSTEES

A. Qualification of Library Trustees

Service on a Board of Library Trustees constitutes a public trust. It carries with it the responsibility to render faithful service, and to provide enlightened leadership, which will promote the best library service the community, can afford.

The Board of Library Trustees should be composed of men and women representing the highest standards of the community. An ideal board member is an able and dedicated person with integrity, imagination, and enthusiasm, a sense of humor, and love and respect of books. Additional qualities, which will enhance the value of an individual as a board member, are:

- 1. Understanding of cultural, social and economic conditions in the community.
- 2. Appreciation of the role of the library as an educational center for the whole community.
- 3. Ability to help make the library appreciated and respected in the community.
- 4. Availability to give the time and effort required for board and committee meetings.
- 5. Willingness to keep informed on library trends, developments, and progress so that the program will constantly grow according to modern requirements.
- 6. Willingness to present the library fiscal, building, and program needs to appropriating bodies and the community.

B. Authority

Libraries in unincorporated towns and villages may be established and operated under the Unincorporated Towns Library Act. This is found in the California Education Code, Sections 27501-27665. Upon the establishment of the library district, the Board of Trustees consisting of five members, is constituted and continued in the manner prescribed in the Education code.

C. Selection and Appointment

- 1. Election-Section 27601 of the Education Code in part, is amended to read: (8-20-74)
 - a. Elections shall be held biennially, in the odd numbered years, at the General Election.
 - b. The Trustees shall hold office for a term of four years beginning on the first Friday in December after their election, or in the case of names not appearing on the ballot, appointment by the Orange County Board of Supervisors
- 2. Vacancies of Unexpired Term-Notice of Vacancy is announced to the local newspapers and posted in three (3) conspicuous locations. Applications are available at the library director's office. The Library Board will screen all applications and make an appointment. The Orange County Board of Supervisors will be informed of the appointment. (Govt. Code 1780.)

D. <u>Duties and Responsibilities</u>

The duties and powers of boards of library trustees are set forth in the following section of the Education Code of California, libraries in unincorporated towns and villages, Sections 27501-27665.

Generally, the board of library trustees is responsible for maintaining the total effectiveness of the library service, and for keeping the public informed of the library's policies, services, and needs. The board has a public relations responsibility to interpret the library to the community it serves.

The following duties and responsibilities are prescribed by law:

- 1. The board manages the affairs of the library district. (In practice, the board determines policy, and delegates administration to the director.)
- 2. The board meets at least once each month, with special meetings subject to call by request of a majority of the board's membership, or by the president of the board.
- 3. The board keeps a record of its proceedings.
- 4. The board makes and enforces rules and regulations necessary for the administration and protection of libraries and library properties.
- 5. The board administers trusts, gifts and property received by the library, and may, in some cases, dispose of property for the benefit of the library. It also purchases, builds, or rents, and equips such real property as is necessary for library operations.
- 6. The Board prescribes the duties and powers of the director and other employees of the library, determines the number of and appoints all officers and employees, and fixes their compensation. The officers and employees hold their offices or positions at the pleasure of the board.

- 7. The board purchases necessary library materials and other personal property. The board may borrow, lend and exchange books by arrangement with other libraries, and may allow non-residents to borrow books upon such conditions as may be prescribed.
- 8. The board delegates to the director the rendering of an annual report to the State Librarian on the condition of the library for the period ending June 30 of each year.
- 9. The board adopts a yearly budget with the advice and assistance of the director, presents the budget requirements to the appropriating body, and is prepared to explain and justify the allocation of amounts to be spent for the various items in the budget.
- 10. The board has the power to make a contract with a city or county for library service, and determine the compensation to be paid for such service.
- 11. The board of library trustees may do and perform any and all other acts and things necessary or proper to carry out the provisions of the Education Code relating to libraries.

E. Rules for Library Trustees

- 1. Each trustee should attend library board meetings regularly and carry his full share of responsibility. (Govt. Code 1770.)
- 2. All authority rests with a majority of the board. It must never be assumed by the president or any other member or group of members.

- 3. After a policy or regulation has been adopted by a majority vote of the board, it should receive the unanimous support of board members.
- 4. The board is responsible for adequate financial support of the library and for economical and efficient use of funds.
- 5. The board should select a director who will merit and receive the confidence of the board as a satisfactory administrator of the library.
- 6. Directives and recommendations to the director should emanate from a majority of the board at a regular or duly called special meeting.
- 7. The director should attend board meetings except when his/her own salary or other conditions of employment are being discussed.
- 8. Complaints from the public, staff grievances, and other problems should be taken up at a regular or duly called special meeting of the board. They should not be handled by individual board members.
- 9. News releases and other releases of information should be made by the director or a designated board member. Confidential discussions of the board in executive session should be respected.

10. All meetings of the board shall be conducted under the laws pertaining to the Brown Act. (Govt. Code 54950 to 54961.)

III. BOARD ORGANIZATION AND PROCEDURES

A. Officers

The December Regular Meeting shall be designated as the Annual Meeting for the purpose of nominating and electing the officers of the Board: the President and the Secretary.

The term of office shall be one year.

The President and Secretary shall serve no more than two consecutive terms. In the event no other member of the Board of Trustees is able to accept nomination to office, the incumbent may continue in office until the next Annual Meeting when another member is available to serve in the office.

At the December Meeting the President will appoint two representatives from the Library Board of Trustees to the Placentia Library Foundation Board of Trustees to serve for one year.

B. Duties of Officers

President—The president of the board shall preside at all meetings, appoint all committees, authorize call for any special meetings, certify (with the secretary) all bills approved by the board, and generally perform the duties of a presiding officer.

Secretary—The secretary shall authenticate the proceedings of each board meeting, write official letters on behalf of the board, and file copies of such letters with the

Placentia Library District Board of Trustees Handbook, Revised April 10, 1998, Page 10.

board's records. The secretary shall perform the duties of president in his/her absence.

C. Meetings

The board of library trustees shall meet at least once a month at such time and place as may be decided by the board. At the request of any three members, special meetings may be called with 24 hours notice, which notice shall be written, posted, and delivered to all board members.

- 1. Minutes of Meetings: A true and accurate account of all proceedings of board meetings shall be recorded by the secretary or by one appointed by the board from library staff for this specific purpose. All motions shall be recorded as stated, and their adoption or rejection shall be shown in the minutes. The minutes shall be sent to board members prior to the next meeting.
- 2. Quorum: A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of a majority of the members of the board.

D. <u>Duties of the Director</u>

As the chief administrative officer of the library, the director is responsible for the management of the library within the framework of the policies adopted by the board.

- 1. The director is responsible for preparing the annual budget request for adoption by the library board, and for administering the budget after its approval.
- 2. The director is in charge of library personnel, and handles such matters as staff appointments, assignments of duties, service standards, promotions and transfers, approval of salary increments in conformity with classification and pay plans, staff development and morale, disciplinary actions, and any necessary dismissal of employees.

- 3. The director is ultimately responsible for selecting books and other library materials.
- 4. The director is responsible for developing a program of public relations according to the community's needs.
- 5. The director is responsible for preparing an annual report and forwarding it to the State Librarian to comply with the state law.

In the advisory capacity of professional expert to the board, the director is responsible for attending board meetings (except when matters relating to the position of director are under consideration), for recommending policies, programs, and changes, and for conducting such investigations and making such reports as the board may from time to time require.

E. The Library Board and the Director

The closest cooperation and harmony should be maintained between the library board and the director. Each should keep the other fully informed of major decisions and actions.

As a body elected by the community, the library board maintains the ultimate authority for the library:

- 1. It informs itself about general library objectives and makes plans for the management of the library in the light of these objectives.
- 2. It establishes policies and resolutions in regard to: (a) finances, including the acquisition of funds; (b) property; (c) library equipment and materials; (d) personnel; (e) services, including rules and regulations; and (f) public relations.
- 3. It selects and appoints a qualified director in whom it has confidence and to whom it gives full support and encouragement to serve as the manager and administrator of the library.

F. Miscellaneous

- 1. Telephone credit cards may be issued to each trustee for the purpose of carrying on library business from home or office as required.
- To encourage participation in library related activities; the District will
 reimburse expenses incurred for travel, meals, lodging and conference fees.
 The library board can be requested to give advance approval for
 reimbursement.
- 3. Memberships for trustees in professional associations for public library trustees and independent special district directors, are paid for by the District. These provide the trustees with periodicals and bulletins to keep them aware of library and special district activities within the state.

IV PLACENTIA LIBRARY SUPPORT ORGANIZATIONS

A. Definition and Purpose

Two independent, not-for-profit organizations have been established by Library supporters to supplement the Library's revenue, public relations activities, programs, and volunteer recruitment. Both of these organizations are certified as non-profit corporations by the California Secretary of State, and have been granted 501 (c) (3) status by the Internal Revenue Service. This means that donations to both of these organizations are tax deductible. Both organization are managed by Boards of Directors which are self-perpetuating and operate in close cooperation with, but administratively independent of, the Library Board of Trustees. The Library Director is an *ex officio* member of both Boards of Directors. Placentia's public library is designated as the sole beneficiary of the activities of both of these organizations. The Library provides administrative support to both of these organizations through the active participation of the Library Director, Administrative Assistant, and Volunteer Coordinator.

B. Friends of Placentia Library

The Friends of Placentia Library was established in 1968. Its mission is to foster closer relations between the Placentia Library and the citizens of Placentia, and to support the functions, resources and needs of the Library.

The Friends of Placentia Library is a membership organization. It conducts day-to-day fundraising through book sales, membership contributions, and special events to fund current-year programs and projects for the Library. The Friends conducts an annual Author's Brunch in support of the Adopt-A-Book program of Placentia Library Foundation.

Friends of Placentia Library grants and gifts to the Library are coordinated through the Library Director.

The Library Board of Trustees sends a representative to each Friends of Placentia Library Board Meeting to encourage the Friends in its activities, and to keep an open channel of communication between the two boards. The Friends of Placentia Library President or a designated representative is encouraged to attend and make a report at each Library Board of Trustees Regular Meeting.

The Board of Directors of the Friends of Placentia Library appoints one of its members to the Placentia Library Foundation Board of Directors.

C. Placentia Library Foundation

Placentia Library Foundation was established in 1994. Its mission is to ensure the future provision of resources and services at Placentia Library District through building and managing endowment and capital funds, and providing grants to the Placentia Library District from these funds. Specific programs supported by the Foundation include: The Library's collection of books, magazines and audiovisual materials; the Library's

reference and information services; the Library's facilities and equipment; and special Library projects.

Placentia Library Foundation is not a membership organization. It raises money through an annual giving campaign for individuals and corporations, and a planned giving program. The main projects of Placentia Library Foundation are the Adopt-A-Book program for the purchase of current-year books and magazines, and the Book Endowment Program for long term financial security. The Foundation offers named endowment programs designed around each donor's specifications. The Foundation also seeks grants in support of Library programs, services, and facilities.

Placentia Library Foundation grants and gifts to the Library are coordinated through the Library Director.

The Library Board of Trustees appoints at its December annual meeting each year, two (2) representatives to the Placentia Library Foundation Board of Directors. The Friends of Placentia Library Board of Directors appoints one (1) representative to the Placentia Library Foundation Board of Directors. The Placentia Library Foundation Board of Directors appoints additional directors for terms of office specified in the By-laws of the Foundation.

Attachment A is a request from Librarian II Cyrise Smith for an advance of vacation time to accommodate her participation in the the Rotary International Group Study Exchange Team (GSE) visit to New South Wales, Australia in March 2001.

Ms. Smith's time in Australia will consist of four weeks with GSE and one week in Sydney. A minimum of three days of library visits will be included in the GSE schedule and a minimum of two days in Sydney. I am arranging for Ms. Smith to visit with several Sydney area librarians who are long-time friends of mine and who have toured library systems in the United States, including my previous system in Iowa.

Ms. Smith has recently changed from a two-week annual vacation accrual to a three-week annual vacation accrual with the District. She will need 200 vacation or administrative hours for her trip. When she is ready to leave for Australia she will have a vacation balance of approximately 110 hours.

Tutor Training. The Literacy Coordinator conducted a tutor training workshop on Sunday, November and eight tutors were trained, four adults and four teens. An accelerated training was also conducted in November, and two additional high school students were trained. All ten new tutors are matched and tutoring in the Library. The next tutor training is scheduled for December 17.

New Families for Literacy (FFL) Program Grows and Experiences a First. The FFL Program had two new families begin in November, for a total now of three families participating in the FFL component. The Literacy Staff was really excited when both the mother and father of one of our new families came into the program. They brought their two children, ages six and three, and it was a true family experience. The two new families found out about our FFL program from the flyers we took to the Placentia Head Start. We are still in the process of recruiting additional tutors and families for our new FFL Program.

Federal Work Study (FWS) Program. In November, we welcomed our fourth and fifth FWS staff members, Reza Khanjan and Charis Medina, and both can work up to twenty hours a week. Reza will be trained as a tutor and tutor children, but the majority of his time will be dedicated to working for Cyrise Smith in the Children's Department. Charis, who is Spanish bilingual, will be our interface with the Placentia Head Start School to recruit more FFL families. She will also tutor, and she plans to start an ESL class targeted at low-level Hispanic students. The Library is very fortunate to have so much high quality talent coming to us from the FWS Program.

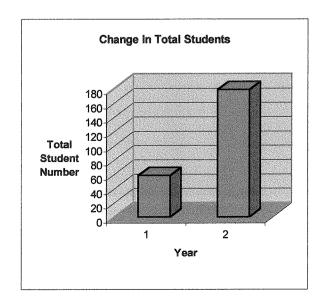

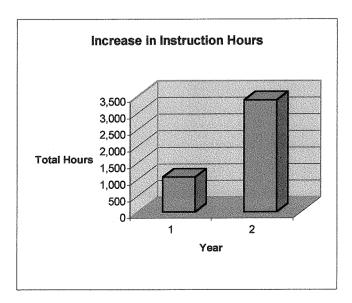

Learning basics in city's first literacy lessons

One Spanish-speaking graduate of program car finally write letters to her mother.

There are five Spanish-speaking 30-year-olds in town who are a step closer to being better communicators, thanks to the city's new Spanish Literacy program.

"They're so excited," Spanish Literacy instructor Nancy Morysaid. "I have one gal who can't wait to write to her mother in Mexico."

The program — sponsored by the Human Services Divi-

sion — is the first of its kind for an Orange County city.

The classes are designed to teach Spanish-speaking residents a basic level of literacy, so they can better understand what's going on in the community

And, now that the graduates are reading, their next step will be lessons in English as a second language.

The recently wrapped-up literacy class met twice weekly since September, focusing on basic reading, writing and

phonic skills in Spanish.

"In some cases, (the students) don't know if they need to read from left to right," Mory said. "They can't tell the difference between lowercase and capital letters. They don't know how to write them."

Besides not speaking English, more than 300 people in the city are illiterate in their native language, said Jim Roberts, Placentia Library District public services manager.

Mory said the adults in her class have had little or no schooling in any language.

"Going to school was a real hardship for them," she said. "They couldn't afford pencils and papers. School was only for those who had enough money to go."

To help set up the reading program, the Placentia/Yorba Linda branch of Altrusa International Inc. — which promotes literacy, community and economic well-being — gave \$700 to pay for teacher and school supplies.

Altrusa President Carol Ebbinghouse said Marisa Cordova, the city's human services manager, told the charitable group about the program.

"People will be able to understand each other better and come together more when they're speaking the same language. We're hoping it will make teaching ESL classes easier," Ebbinghouse said. Meanwhile, Mory hopes her students will continue their

Meanwhile, Mory hopes her students will continue their education. "They need so much help, but I'm very optimistic," she said.

"It's given them so much confidence. Knowing that they are able to learn makes them feel good, that they can just go right into learning."

Congress ignites Net filter fight

The feds want to find out who's naughty or nice with new legislation requiring most schools and libraries to filter Net content.

Schools and libraries that receive federal funds will find new strings attached to the money -- they'll have to filter Internet content.

An amendment attached to a sweeping appropriations bill that Congress passed Friday would require most of the nation's public schools to block visual depictions of child pornography, obscenity, or other material deemed inappropriate for children.

But free speech advocates already are planning lawsuits to challenge the measure, which they say violates the First Amendment.

"It's a violation by censoring what adults can view in a library," said Ann Beeson, an ACLU staff attorney, who said the measure was similar to "Congress asking for an entire type of book removed from a library, which it hasn't done before."

In the past, the ACLU has successfully blocked free-speech threatening amendments that had been attached to appropriations bills, including the Communications Decency Act.

Broad-brush approach

The legislation that passed Friday is the culmination of two years of negotiations by proponents of filtering mandates and others who fear they might be overly restrictive.

David Crane, an aide to Sen. John McCain (R.-Ariz.), one of the measure's sponsors, said the bill is intentionally broad, leaving local communities and schools to pick their own technology and define terms such as "obscenity."

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The FCC, charged with enforcing the law, cannot force its definitions of inappropriate materials on others, according to Crane. "It is entirely up to local authorities. You decide what you want blocked and how you want it blocked."

The Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education Appropriations Bill (HR 4577), now headed to the president's desk for signature, gives schools and libraries 120 days to present their filtering plans to the federal government.

Software limitations

Filtering software is designed to block material deemed inappropriate for children, such as sites containing violent or pornographic images. However, critics complain the software often goes too far, unintentionally banning sites that are neither offensive nor controversial.

In recent months, free speech group <u>Peacefire.org</u> has shown that some software blocks content that many educators probably would want children to see, including the Web sites of some Congressional candidates and pages of Amnesty International.

Even filtering companies -- which stand to make millions if the new measure stands -- have reservation about the new bill.

Nika Herford, a spokesman for Net Nanny Software International Inc., said the new rules will require that some filtering products be revamped, since it specifically applies to visual depictions.

What's naughty, what's nice?

"That right there is somewhat problematic," said Herford, who explained that while Net Nanny softwar can block images, singling out pornographic images will be a challenge. "And then what do you do about fine art?"

What's more, she said it would be difficult for companies to design products that can adapt to meet the standards of communities as diverse as California and, say, the Bible Belt.

"The legislation is well-meaning, but may not necessarily have the outcome the people who wrote it hoped it would have," Herford said.

Already several communities have rejected mandatory blocking software. Two years ago, in Loudoun County, Va., a judge ruled that a plan to install filtering software in the county's public library violated free speech.

Let the courts decide

Last February, residents of conservative Holland, Mich., voted against mandatory filtering in the nation first referendum on the issue.

Rob Courtney, a policy analyst at the Center for Democracy and Technology, said citizens there will now have to use filtering technology, like it or not.

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Many parents find filtering software packages useful, Courtney said, "But to mandate them in every community is to mandate their strengths as well as their shortcomings."

Courtney said his group also might consider joining cases filed by groups such as the ACLU.

"Once the legislative options have come up dry, litigation is the way to go," he said.

ACLU Fighting Internet Filtering

WASHINGTON (AP) - Schools and libraries must begin using Internet filtering software next year to protect children from pornography or risk losing federal money - thanks to a mandate approved by lawmakers before they left town.

The requirement is raising concerns among free speech advocates who say it violates the Constitution and, perhaps ironically, from software makers worried that filtering technology is not a cure-all for protecting kids.

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"This is a mandated censorship system by the federal government," said Chris Hansen, a lawyer for the American Civil Liberties Union, which plans to sue in an effort to block the law.

After the law takes hold, "no adult anymore can read what they want at the library," Hansen said Tuesday.

Supporters believe the law will withstand a court challenge and provide a reasonable way to protect children from Internet smut.

"We drafted it to make sure it was constitutional," said John Albaugh, chief of staff for Rep. Ernest Istook, R-Okla. who helped push the measure.

At issue is the Children's Internet Protection Act, which was unexpectedly attached to a \$450 billion federal spending bill Congress passed last Friday before recessing for the year. President Clinton (news web sites) is expected to sign the bill into law.

Any school or library that refused to install filtering software on its computers would lose vital federal funds for technology upgrades.

The measure's appearance in the larger spending bill surprised those who had been following the issue some of whom didn't discover it until Monday. Several versions of the mandatory-filtering plan had floated through Congress in recent months.

The ACLU has made successful challenges to similar laws passed to keep kids from seeing objectionable material online, including the Communications Decency Act, Children's Online Protectio Act and several state measures.

But the censorship argument is only part of opponent's attack.

Opponents also say the filtering programs don't work, blocking more Web sites than they should while letting some pornography sites through.

Recently, anti-filtering groups have shown top filtering programs to block out sites belonging to human rights group Amnesty International, House Majority Leader Dick Armey, R-Texas, and a digitized copy of the novel ``Jane Eyre."

Supporters of the bill, including the office of Sen. Rick Santorum, R-Pa., acknowledge the programs aren't perfect but say that any protection is better than nothing at all.

The ACLU's Hansen disagreed.

"The First Amendment doesn't have a 'good enough' requirement as part of it," Hansen said. "Suppose we said it would be better than nothing for someone to go into Barnes and Noble and burn every tenth book. That sort of casual insensitivity to censorship is disturbing."

The legislation states that the filtering software can be disabled by a library administrator for adult use only for ``bona fide research or other lawful purpose."

A representative from the filtering industry leader also disagreed with the bill.

"Things that mandate specific technologies probably aren't the best solution here. Let the free market decide, and let us improve these products all the time," said Susan Getgood, a SurfCONTROL vice president, in an interview.

SurfCONTROL owns the two most-used filtering tools, CyberPatrol and SurfWatch. Its technology also powers America Online's Web filter.

"My chief criticism is that I don't think it's necessary because schools are already doing what they need to do to protect their students," Getgood said.

Some conservative groups also object to the bill because it takes local control away from communities who run schools and libraries and doesn't provide new money to buy or maintain the software.

Last year, the town of Holland, Mich., decided in a local referendum not to use filters in their library. The federal legislation would override that vote.

The Clinton administration tried to soften the measure, offering more choice to communities, but faced

stiff resistance in Congress. Presidential aides decided the concerns weren't worth jeopardizing the entire spending bill.

The ACLU plans to file its suit next year after President-elect Bush is in office. But another filtering opponent, Peacefire, is offering a different solution.

It has released a program it says ``can disable all popular Windows blocking programs with the click of a button."

The bill is H.R. 4577.
