Language Experience: All About Me

In December all parents were given a "\$10.00 Credit" at California School Book Fairs, Inc., and by utilizing their 50¢ book bins parents could purchase books for all members of the family for Christmas. These books were gift wrapped and given out to the children by Santa Claus at our family Christmas party on December 13.

2. Briefly explain the types, structure and content of the regular meetings of parents and children conducted by FFL in public library settings. How often do you hold these meetings? (This should include but not be limited to family storytimes.)

Meetings are held twice a week-one day for English tutoring and one day for family activity designed to reinforce the literacy skills being introduced, and to model positive reading experiences.

Volunteer tutors from Placentia Library Literacy Services work with the parents in small structured groups. The parents are homogeneously grouped to best meet the language needs.

Family activities vary greatly but emphasize learning potential within the home setting. Each activity day begins with a story telling session and then extends the story to readiness activities, i.e. Strega Nona day we made non cooked granola meatballs (emphasizing oral language and how the words in the recipe told us what to do), A Shaghetti Cutting Contest (cutting paper into strips to see which team could fill a bowl first) Then wrote, illustrated and shared "The Day I ate like big Anthony" stories.

Our story time at the beginning of each activity day is a quiet time when parents are encouraged to hold their children and share a pleasant experience together.

- 2f. Do you hold family storytimes outside of the library? If yes, where and how often? How do you then mainstream the FFL families into library storytimes?

Our regular meeting facility is located next to HeadStart, 1.8 miles from the library. Once a month our family activity is a visit to the library. The children attend a story time with the Children's Librarian, while the adults are introduced to different areas of the library by the library staff.

Few participants have their own mode of transportation and public transportation costs prohibit library visits more often than once a month.

3) If you promote the enjoyment of reading for your parents in ways other than the regular meetings described in #2 above, please describe.

Before our December trip to the California School Book Fair Inc. (See answer B1) we focused on how to select appropriate books for their children. This included age appropriate material and book construction, as well as, observation and listening skills to become more aware of individual children's interests and abilities. Utilizing age and information appropriate books 5 helps to ensure a pleasurable reading experience will be shared.

4) Please describe how tutors/teachers are incorporating language experience stories and children's literature from the FFL program in the adult learner's instructional program. Briefly describe how/when you train tutors in these techniques.

Our first goal was to focus on oral language development and to establish family reading patterns. From this grew language experience activities and developing story extension ideas. All books used in the program were modeled with the adults prior to introducing them to the children. Learning necessary vocabulary, and developing the adults reading pattern for that story became a part of their lesson. After Easter parents began taking resposibility for extension activities which frequently included language experience stories.

A segment of the 18 hour tutor training is devoted to Family Literacy and it's specific requirements. Regular communication is maintained with the tutors regarding our planned monthly activities. Tutors are encouraged to participate in all activities to increase their learning through the group presentations and supervision by the Family Literacy Coordinator.

5) Do you train parents in book selection for their children other than the use of storytimes and lapsits for modeling to parents listed under question B-2 or 3? If yes, please describe.

Yes. We focused on book selection prior to our Christmas visit to California School Books Inc. We utilized an information booklet, published by Reading Is Fundamental, entitled "Choosing Good Books For Your Children - Infancy to age 12". Each parent was given a copy which we discussed together. We also discussed listening and observation skills to help parents focus on each of their children as individuals - discovering interests and abilities.

At our monthly library visits parents were encouraged to select library books with their children for use at home. These book selections were monitored by the FFL Coordinator, the Children's Librarian, her assistant, and FFL tutor volunteers.

6) Do you provide any other FFL services that enhance full family participation and foster a family environment conducive to reading other than those already listed? If yes, please describe.

By running the program at HeadStart, which is centrally located to the community, the program is naturally enhanced.

7) How do you help parents in using services to access books and other materials on such topics as parenting, child care, health, nutrition and family life education, as well as assistance in the use of the full range of library services.

Through our monthly visits to the library, the parents were introduced to each section of the library by the appropriate library staff. Parents received library cards and were given time, while their children were in storytime, to locate books and materials with assistance as needed from library staff. Parents were taught how to use the computer catalogue system and learned who and where to go for assistance.

A limited 'library' of nutrition and child development books were available at HeadStart.

8) Do you provide any other services which enable families to participate in the Families for Literacy Program? If yes, briefly describe. If incentives were used, please list.

Free transportation from HeadStart to any of our programs not located at the site was provided for the families.

In May a child care facility became available to us so that free child care could be provided during literacy classes.

Donated and discounted admissions to local attractions and community functions were used as incentives and rewards for regular, consciencious participation.

9) How do you recruitment your families? Is that effective? Any particularly effective retention strategies?

Our initial recruitment was through flyers distributed at HeadStart and the library. Since then word of mouth has been all that was needed to fill our programs.

Our tutors developed a close personal relationship with the families and kept contact when people missed. That personal relationship was instrumental in retaining students.

10) How many FFL staff were budgeted for with FFL or library funds? Was this adequate? Explain.

Once we added the group leader, the level of service and participation to all families was excellent.

Two child care positions were added on in May and FFL funded.

11) How do you determine or measure success in your FFL program?

How do you track the progress of your adults and children as they move through their FFL involvement?

We believe that part of our success must be measured by the number of participating families and the retention of those families. Our proposal anticipated the involvement of only 15 families while we actually served 61.

The huge influx of students in January and February made individual language testing time consuming and a logistical nightmare. We decided to go to portfolio assessment and each tutor assumed responsibility for maintaining notebooks with their students. These notebooks were reviewed at our last meeting in June for growth and personal evaluation. (OVER)

1) Describe those elements of your program that you feel have been most successful. What are the key factors that have contributed to their success (e.g., talents, library administrative support, communication, etc).

Our weekly family activity days have proven to be very popular The activities are planned as adult/child interactive and all family members are invited to participate.

Hands on activities, like cooking, games, puppet making, role playing, and crafts allow structure for confidence but open-endedness for appropriate ability and English language levels. The FFL Coordinator's background as a reading teacher in a local school servicing this community proved extremely beneficial. On going dialogues with the participating families about their needs and interests enabled us to plan programs that kept people coming back each week.

The involvement of the City of Placentia and the Placentia-Yorba Linda Unified School District has meant improved programs, but more (OVER)

2) An important element of FFL is the cooperation between Children's Services and the adult literacy program/FFL program. Discribe your relationship with Children's Services in your library and how you have worked together in FFL.

Our Children's Services Librarian has been an outstanding and consistant resource. She has provided and suggested book lists and activities and related materials. She has visited, and assisted, on family activity days and, of course, provided outstanding story times at the library. Her warmth and interest in these families is a motivation to them to make their way to the library and become regular patrons.

- 3) Describe the most difficult challenges your program has faced so far and what actions you have initiated to overcome them. Are these actions proving successful?
 - a) Transportation to and from the library: We are still negotiating with the city to help provide regular transportation and we are making progress.
 - b) Child care: Until May we had no room facility for child care during tutoring sessions. Child care made a substantial difference to the quality of our tutoring times.
 - c) "Red Tape": Maintaining room facilities, working out cost reimbursements with the county auditors for food and supplies, and maintaining appropriate communication between the library and HeadStart. Getting any new program started is challenging and we are meeting each new challenge as it comes, mostly with success.
- 4) If you knew at the outset of your program what you know now, what, if any, changes would you make?
 - a) I would have budgeted for more families and another paid "group leader".
 - b) Sought a greater involvement from the business community.
 - c) Requested regular meetings with involved library staff to insure proper communication and help with handling "red tape".
- 5) Now that you have returned from the Family Literacy Conference and have had time to evaluate your experience there, what were the most valuable contributions of that conference to your own program? What changes have you made based on your team's experiences there?
 - a) The conference increased the level of interest and commitment of the Library Director to the program. This resulted in regular literac team meetings and a higher profile for the program within the library.
 - b) I learned a great deal about portfolio evaluation and was able to apply that to our evalutaion process.
 - c) The conference greatly increased my knowledge of the intent and requirements of the program and at what level those "concepts" are decided. This knowledge has helped me in recruiting, organizing and planning.

How do you see the future of the Families for Literacy Program in your library? What aspects have you already incorporated into regular library services? What aspects of the FFL program could you offer in your setting by reallocating resources or without outside (funding other than that provided by your library or community) funding? What are the barriers to achieving incorporation?

With the outstanding support of the library and the community, FFL has a very good future here. We are expanding parent information available at the library in English and other languages. We are looking into transportation systems and trying to coordinate story telling times with public or city sponsored transportation. We are establishing a small lending library of books and materials for both children and adults to be available at HeadStart. We hope this will supplement family trips to the library when no transportation is available. We are pursuing an increased involvement and commitment to the program from the City of Placentia, the Placentia Yorba Linda Unified School District, other city volunteer and service organization, and the business community.

Our current toddler storytime requires parental involvement and incorporates shared reading time modeling. We are establishing bilingual storytimes for our families whose children do not speak English. We are conducting community interest lectures in languages other than English.
