Night is a memoir by Elie Wiesel who is a Holocaust survivor. The memoir focuses

characters besides Elie are Shlomo Wiesel, Moshe the Beadle, Mrs Schachter, and Dr. Josef

Nazis are doing. Mrs. Schachter is one of the other people on the train to Auschwitz with Elie

and had visions about there being a fire, where she repeatedly screamed about it. Her visions

later on become true. Additionally, Dr. Josef Mengele is a famous Nazi doctor who decides at

the Auschwitz concentration camp on what to do with incoming prisoners.

I thought that the memoir was very emotional. I liked how Elie and his father, Shlomo

kept supporting each other during the troubling and brutal times they both went through. One

part of the memoir that surprised me was when a woman on the train named Mrs. Schachter

had visions about there being a fire. Later on in the story, the visions shockingly become true.

I would recommend this book to anyone who wants to learn about what the Holocaust was like. This book reminds me of another book called "*The Diary of a Young Girl*," which was written by Anne Frank.
